Ladies,

I have much pleasure in presenting to you the fifteenth Annual Report of this Association for the season 1948-1949.

MEMBERSHIP.

The opening of the season saw seventeen teams, representing eight clubs, take the field (i.e. an increase of two teams on last year's figures). However, after the early withdrawal of three, there only remained fourteen.

As can be clearly seen the number of players has dropped considerably below the number of pre-war years, and it is stressed again on all Clubs to do their utmost in introducing as many new players as possible to the game.

UMPIRES COMMITTEE.

The Umpires Committee comprising Mrs. R. Risson, Miss D. Banks and Miss M. Irvine did a slightly different job from last year. It had been decided earlier in the season that the allotting of umpires for fixture games be left in the hands of the fixture committee and that Mrs. Risson act as Convener between the two committees. This scheme proved very satisfactory.

Each of the Committee expressed her willingness to do what she could to help umpires and each Saturday these ladies were to be seen on the field helping other umpires. The benefit of this coaching could be clearly seen in the all round improvement and confidence shown in the work of some of the younger players. Our sincere thanks go to Mrs. Risson for her untiring efforts in giving short lectures on the field and her lecture on the All Australian paper.

The badge system was re-introduced this season, but owing to the heavy duties of the Committee there was no time for the classification of umpires to be done. So it is hoped that each umpire will have a badge in her possession during the forthcoming season.

There was a marked improvement in the number of umpires as compared with last year. Thanks are extended to all girls who rendered her services in this capacity.
