Ladies,

I have much pleasure in submitting to you the twenty-sixth Annual Report of the Brisbane Women's Hockey Association, covering the 1958-59 Season. The past Season, Queensland's Centenary Year, has proved to be the busiest yet, on record, and I sincerely thank all of you for making it such a successful year.

OPENING DAY: The 1959 Season Opening Day was held in conjunction with the Queensland Women's Basket Ball Association to mark the official opening of Downey Park as a Women's Sports Reserve. Mrs. T.R. Groom officiated on this day with our own President and Mrs. Mills as president of the Basket Ball Association also speaking. A March Past of both Associations was held, followed by a Fete - to mark the Opening Day - the 4th April, 1959.
