

For instance -

A member of one Club on twelve occasions during the season played for the team higher than the one in which she was registered, played only 9 games for her registered team and on 7 of these occasions played two games on the day.

Several Clubs have borrowed 4, 5 and 6 members from lower teams to make up the higher teams and in several instances, have borrowed as many as 7 from their lower teams and once went as far as borrowing 8.

This, I feel admittedly, may avoid forfeits, but is it fair to those Clubs who have only two or three teams, and it is made more unjust when one considers that in allocating times of matches, the larger clubs are given greater consideration inasmuch as rarely do all, or the major number of their teams, play at the same time. - this consideration has been given mainly to assist the club officials but it would appear that the privilege is being wrongly administered.

Rules stipulate, a team must field 9 players to play a fixture match. May I suggest that perhaps the rule could include -

"To play a fixture game, a Team must comprise 8 of its registered membership"

thus to avoid a forfeit, a team could borrow from 1 - 3 players of a lower grade.

c. Registrations: The present method of slips of paper is very haphazard and I would like to recommend that a special book be placed on the canteen counter. As well, I feel, a rule should be formulated along this line -
"New Registrations must be entered in the Special Book provided, together with any fees applicable.

Such registrations will be accredited for the time being to the lowest team in the respective Club but advice in writing must be forwarded within 14 days as to the definite team membership of such new player".

d. Degrading of Players: During recent years, the degrading of players has usually meant the handing in of a letter on the grounds and hasty Executive approval.
Might I here suggest that the Executive deal with the degrading of players, any alterations to teams, in fact, any matters relating to fixtures and records, only at its monthly meetings. I do not feel this would create any great imposition on any Club as teams should not be changing from week to week, and it would allow the Executive to deal with any requests, problems or complaints with the thought and care which such requires if our Association is to operate efficiently.
