## UMPIRES' CONVENOR'S REPORT

Ladies,

I have much pleasure in presenting the report on behalf of the Umpires' Committee.

Again, I must report the difficulty in detecting those really interested in umpiring. It would appear that few are interested early and merely umpire as a club duty. Only by observation can I honestly say that I have found a few keen to go ahead. Some may never make top grade, but the conscientious umpire is better to the game than the disinterested badged umpire. At least the players can enjoy their game without the problem of erratic decision, the conscientious umpire may be misinterpreting or even neglecting a rule, but at least she is the same for both sides on all occasions.

The Umpires Committee still has difficulty in arranging meetings as so many members have club commitments. However, we would like to put the following forward for consideration:

"That in the event of an Umpire being recommended for tests at the A A Tournament, she be given the same monetary consideration as Brisbane players selected in the Queensland Team."

Most Clubs fulfilled their obligations although in several Clubs, a willing few are carrying the burden and I am often accused of asking a player to umpire too frequently when actually she is not listed but doing the job for someone else.

I hesitate to name individuals, but special commendation must be accorded Cheryl Morris (Kelvin Grove T.C.) - 18 matches; Denise von Nida and Dalma Springfield (V) - 12 matches; Diane McBryde (Tax) - 11 matches; Vicky Morrow (V) - 10 matches.

For the actual supply of umpires - Valleys (6 teams) - 132 umpires during the season and Taxation (4 teams) - 120 umpires, are well ahead of other Clubs. Ascot (4 teams) and St. Andrews (4 teams) were well back with 80 umpires.

The All Australia Umpires Theory Examination attracted 110 candidates, whose results included 15 'A', 33 'B' and 28 'C' passes and 34 failures. The top three places in Queensland went to Brisbane candidates -
