SECRETARY'S REPORT

Ladies,

I hereby submit to you the Thirty-Fourth Annual Report of the activities of B.W.H.A. As you well know, the 1967 Season could have been, in part, a disastrous one for our association, owing to the ruinous floods prior to the Interstate Tournament. That it was not, was due to having competent people in authority, ably assisted by willing workers and to the generosity of those who helped in other ways. Our heartfelt thanks to all concerned.

Opening Day - 15/4/67.

The 1967 Season was officially opened in showery conditions by the Lady Mayoress, Mrs. C. Jones. Fortunately, the spirits of the teams, unlike their uniforms, were not dampened by the rain and the March Past was performed cheerfully and enthusiastically to the music of the Police Pipe Band. After the Opening Ceremony and the judging of "Miss Hockey" afternoon tea was served. Miss Nancy Learyod was chosen as Miss Hockey 1967.

Membership

A full list of teams and their gradings and points as well as premiership honours is present in the Record Secretary's Report but to be brief, 54 teams competed in fixtures, and increase of six from last year.

Meetings

The Annual Meeting was held on 14th March, 1967 at Willard House. Six General meetings and eight Executive meetings were held; our final meeting for 1967, scheduled for September 26th, being cancelled as there was not a quorum in attendance. Clubs must realize that more knowledge of Association General Business leads to better understanding of the requirements of the Association in order to make each season an enjoyable one for all concerned.

Social Games

Trips were made by Brisbane Teams and individual Clubs to neighbouring towns for Social matches.

State Championships

In wet, cyclonic conditions three teams, under the efficient and sympathetic care of Miss B. Watson, competed enthusiastically in the State Championships at Gympie on the Queen's Birthday Weekend. We were proud of the girls' performances and pleased to have Brisbane 1 again take first place in the competition, and to have nine Brisbane players selected to represent the State in the Interstate Tournament.

Inter-state Championships

The Championships, the "big event" of the season, were played in perfect weather on a splendid field and won by Western Australia. We are sure that spectators and players enjoyed every aspect of the Tournament and the organizers, workers, hostesses and all others concerned in any way, have every reason to feel proud of their efforts. We were all delighted to see Mrs. R. Robinson elected President, Mrs. Langam elected Secretary, and Mrs. Josiffe re-elected Treasurer, of the All Australian Women's Hockey Association, for 1967 - 1968 season. Also, Mrs. Langam was elected to the A.A. Umpires Board and Mrs. Josiffe was elected to the A.A. Selectors Panel.

Congratulations were extended to Kay Kinderwater and Heather Scraggs when they were selected as members of the Australian Team. A special "thank you" to Mrs. Brown and Mrs. Stendrup for their marvellous job in the drink stall; as usual, seeing a little of the actual play.

Coaching

We were extremely fortunate to have Mr. Balkishan Singh, Indian Coach, visit us in July. After seeing him coach, we realized that there is very little, if anything, concerning the game of Hockey that he does not know; nor does he lack the ability to impart this knowledge. Mr. Balkishan Singh made not only the basic principles, but also the more intricate moves appear so simple. He was a very charming person and we wish he could have stayed longer.

Presentations

Financial assistance was given to our Representatives in the Australian Touring Team and also to Brisbane members of the Queensland Team. Gift presentations, in appreciation of work done during the season, especially in connection with the flooding and the Inter-State Tournament, were made to Mr. I. Byrne, and Mr. D. Ferris. At a function in December, at the home of Mr. & Mrs. I. Byrne, officials of B.W.H.A. were presented with gifts, in appreciation of work done for the Association. Cheques in appreciation were presented to the Police Pipe Band and also to St. John's Ambulance.

Australian Representatives.

On an overseas tour, ensuring one's own arrival at the arranged accommodation, functions etc., and departure points at the appointed time would be no mean task. Hence, imagine the work involved managing a whole Hockey Team in this respect. That of course was just one aspect of Mrs. Robinson's duties as Manageress of the Touring Team. Needless to say, she performed all her tasks with the usual efficiency and enthusiasm. Kay Kinderwater and Dianne Hoffman acquitted themselves admirably both on and off the field. To our three representatives we extend sincere congratulations for a job well done.

Canteen

Again we extend our sincere thanks to Mrs. V. R. Crunkhorn and Miss B. Watson for their diligence and competence at either end of the Canteen. A great deal of work is done here.

Publicity

Mrs. R. Robinson and Miss B. Watson arranged our publicity again this season. We are sure that much of the flood assistance we received was in response to the various items relating to our misfortune that were published in the press. Your work is much appreciated, Ladies.

Equipment

The Equipment Officer, Miss S. Otto assisted by Miss H. Bo-wick, had a difficult task after the floods relisting all items still in good order as well as all the new ones. Thank you Shir-l and Helen for your good work this season.

Finance

Mrs. J. McDougall, our Treasurer, assisted by Miss L. Mauchlan, had a very busy time attending to repair and replacement accounts as well as the general accounts of the season. Thank you, Ladies for your assistance.

We extend our sincere thanks to Mr. V.R. Crunkhorn for auditing our books once again.

Grounds Improvements

We were delighted this season to have a new shelter pavillion (The Jessie Groom Pavillion) erected adjacent to the Canteen on the Northern side. New stands were also erected. Unfortunately, many players still leave rubbish beside the fields, even with bins at close hand. Clubs must make a stronger effort to stop this laziness and carelessness by those concerned.

Umpires

A fixture book, of great benefit to all, was printed this season, each official and player receiving a copy. Many thanks to Mrs. Langan, and her assistants who organized times and umpires for the games and a special vote of thanks to Mrs. Langan for the extra trouble of chasing after replacements when some allotted umpires did not appear. Surely players must realize that in order to have games running according to schedule, it is necessary for each person to carry out her allotted task. Candidates for the Umpire's Examination were fewer this season, so let's hope we have more interest shown next season. We were all pleased to see Lyn Dellitt pass her "A.A." at the Inter-State Tournament.

It is a big job to keep the records in order, week during the season; a job which Mrs. F. Wastell, assisted by Mrs. C. Grealy, managed very well. Thanks again Ladies.
