A REPORT OF ACTIVITIES OF THE BRISBANE WOMENS' HOCKEY ASSOCIATION IN ITS FORTY-FOURTH YEAR. A YEAR WHEREIN HOCKEY, AS A WHOLE, MADE GREAT STRIDES WITH AUSTRALIA'S PARTICIPATION IN THE GRAND FINAL OF THE OLYMPICS AT MONTREAL. PEOPLE WHO HAD BARELY KNOWN OF ITS EXISTANCE PREVIOUSLY WERE THEN ANIMATEDLY DISCUSSING THE UMPIRES "PIE EYE", AND ASKING OF RULES ETCETERA.
