PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Every year brings its own sets of opportunities and challenges and 2008 was no exception for Brisbane Women's Hockey Association.

There have been many challenges:

- Management of the turf facility at Burringbar Park being thrown into disarray with the problems with Shawsportz
- Junior numbers diminished for the first time in 4 years
- Unavailability of key stalwarts Mary Cockings and Bron Morris - with subsequent impacts on a number of different areas, including manning of turf Technical Benches and Grounds & Facilities management
- Ongoing reluctance by many players to take on umpiring responsibilities
- Car parking difficulties at Downey Park exacerbated by a concurrent men's winter softball competition
- Management of resources across the three turf venues - State Hockey Centre, Burringbar Park and Redcliffe.

We did not manage all the challenges as well as we would have liked. Having said that, I think though that BWA has risen to the occasion, and that the practices already in place, or getting put in place, together with ongoing improvements and refinements, have helped us to grow with these challenges. I have previously stated that the running of any large organisation needs vigilance and commitment to ensure that our processes and management keep in step with modern governance. I now add that we also need to continually review and innovate to ensure that we maintain relevance to our player base. And whilst progress is sometimes painfully slow we are making progress.

To this end the Constitution Committee is undertaking a major overhaul of our rules of association to bring them into line with modern governance. As part of this review we have been circulating questions and recommendations to Clubs to ensure that the issues are properly canvassed and that the final outcome reflects the majority view. This work is not yet complete.

This year has been the first year since the 1970's where the junior and senior sections of the association have met as one, at both Management and Council level. This step was undertaken to ensure that the association could and did function as one body, and in my view has worked extremely well. One of the benefits has been for Council delegates, who have only needed to attend one (rather than two) Council meetings per month and have had a broad view of all hockey issues, not just seniors or juniors.

Our major considerations for the coming year/s will have to focus on our strategic priorities - extra turf facilities, particularly the feasibility of a turf surface for Downey Park; upgrading the grass surface at Downey Park; growing our player base; and greater use of technology to improve communication and to reduce reliance on volunteers. These are major activities and cannot all be tackled at once - so some considerable effort needs to be given to their planning to ensure we do make progress.

My life, like everyone else's, is fairly busy, particularly since I took on the extra role of President of Hockey Queensland in February this year. So I would particularly like to thank all the members of my management committee for their efforts, consideration, and good humour. To our countless volunteers - thank you, because without you we would not be able to exist.

We have also trimmed the budget for 2009, introducing automated spreadsheets to reduce the workload in the future, my thanks to Karen Hickling for her help with this.

This year we also completed the Admin and Development staff contracts and ensured all were given a formal review at the end of the season. We also introduced simple work contracts for the Canteen staff.

We also continued to update our Representative Policies to ensure good governance of our growing association.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Our planning for season 2008 started officially in October 2007. Throughout the year a number of areas were earmarked as needing attention and these formed the basis of the planning meetings, there is no "off-season" for Management of BWA.

From October to December we again ran "Summer Social Hockey" at the SHC. Aimee Eckermann and Jenny Heron organised this and used the database to produce the draws. It appeared that all that participated enjoyed their games on the turf.

Karin Walduck (President) continued on her mission to ensure transparency and good governance of our association in 2008. Lisa-Maree Jones continued to support her and looked after the Development area, assisting with financial guidance and the updating of Job Descriptions, Mary continued on her mission to ensure our finances remained strong.

After the AGM many of our Management took a well-earned break. The office had a small Christmas function. This was thoroughly enjoyed by all who attended. The office then closed for three weeks to allow the office staff to recharge their batteries ready for a busy 2008.

The 2008 year started with a Management Meeting and first Council Meetings (Junior and Senior). Administration Folders were distributed, new Club officials welcomed, discussions on the fields, the need for a DP Time Steward and the numerous vacancies still on committees. Bronwyn Morris advised that due to a work transfer, she would be leaving Brisbane in April and we would need a new member of Management to cover her House and Grounds Portfolio.

In 2008 we changed the turf usage format to have 1 field at the SHC each week and alternating either BP or Redcliffe as our second field. This was done to allow our members to watch and support the BWA fixtures. 2008 saw our working relations with BWA go from strength to strength, something which we look forward to further developing in the future.

This change in field allocations seemed to have a good impact on the social side of hockey, but had some major problems with administration. Due to the number of teams interested and the added turf availability now that Redcliffe was online, meant Division 2 moved from 8 teams to 10 teams in 2008. Again, this was great for hockey development, but administratively, more headaches - split fixtures was the result and players and personnel racing from Redcliffe or BP to the SHC to act as reserves or support staff, caused a great deal of pain for many. It also made the production of a balanced draw very difficult and during the off-season we will be looking at ways to combat this. Congratulations to Jenny Heron, Sonya Fisher, Lyn Thomas and Meg Brodie for all their hard work in this area to ensure all fixtures were played with suitable umpires, technical officials and sports trainers. The reports from all these sections are contained in the following reports.

The Southern Cross League was played in January and February and then the AHL in March, this did not disrupt our fixtures, and teams competed without their AHL and U18 players to get the season started.

BWA continued to work in utilising the HockeyNet Database system, many Clubs doing a great job in recording all information. Libby Roberts acted as an advisor this year, with Sue Barsby taking over most of the day to day control. There are still some Clubs that need to embrace this system more fully, BWA will not be providing a service to Clubs to enter their results in 2009 and so all Clubs need to ensure they have personnel trained to do this. Lyn Thomas spent countless hours checking stats each week - again she noted some Clubs doing a great job and others doing a poor job. This system must be fully

utilised by 2009, so Clubs need to give this a high priority. The system relies on the integrity of Clubs to input all information correctly, Lyn and her junior counterpart can only check a small portion and spent many hours on the "not so good" Clubs to ensure they fell within our rules. The information put in, will be the living archive of our sport - so I ask all Clubs to embrace the system.

The office continued to allocate the Senior Turf Umpires, with Lesley Bennett doing the Masters and Meg Brodie doing the Grass. Umpiring continues to be the major operational concern of our sport. Some Clubs are doing a fantastic job in development and promotion of this, but some just don't understand that without umpires there is no game. We must make a joint approach to develop umpiring. All members need to give something back to the sport, either Umpiring, Technical, Coaching, Managing or Administration within their Club. We are a volunteer amateur sport, without volunteer (member) support we cannot move forward. Queensland still has some of the best and most promising umpires, but we do not have the depth across all grades, only Clubs can change this fact. HockeyEd was also introduced for Coaching and Officiating, but the system has its problems and we are trying to work through these with HQ. Congratulations to Sonya and her Umpires and Technical Committee for all their work in sending quality umpires to State Championships.

The Juniors again started very short of volunteers. Desley, Debbie and Margie carried the load on a big section of our association. To give them support, they joined with Senior Management and joint Council Meetings were held to reduce the number of times volunteers had to attend meetings. This worked quite well and with a little fine-tuning will be the way forward for the future. Congratulations to Desley, Debbie and Marg for carrying this huge workload. Desley after 7 years has indicated that she will move off the Junior Committee to Seniors and we thank Desley for her leadership and commitment to the Juniors during this time.

When we finally thought we were set for the season to start a number of problems arose. Mary Cockings became very ill in March and finally in April she ended up in hospital and the start of a very long recovery. Mary has during the past 10 years or so taken on more and more roles as our volunteer numbers have dropped, she looked after the Sports Trainers, and the Technical Benches (with Lyn Thomas), worked with the BCC on Grounds issues and leasing, was the main contact for the Clubhouse bookings and security as well as controlled our finances. Having Mary off the radar, caused Management and the office to quickly reorganise tasks and take on a few new ones. Added to this was the departure of Bronwyn to the Northern Territory and the House and Grounds was leaderless until Mary McNeill offered to take on this portfolio - what a steep learning curve for her. The office assisted where it could and we made it through the season, I am sure Mary McNeill has learnt a lot in her first year on Management and we thank her for continuing in this role. I am sure Mary will thank in her report the many people who assisted her in this role - but I must thank Caroline Schomberg, Angela (Bud) Coleman and Wendy Proctor for looking after the bar at most functions, Joyce Proctor and Jenny Tidey for starting the Control Room for seniors until we employed someone and the members who stayed on Saturday afternoons to help Denise lock up.

The next big task was finding a way to cover the Tech Bench duties at the turf, our evergreen Tech Officials especially Ronda Nix, Lyn Thomas, Cheryl Kann, Lesley Bennett and Jenny Heron worked overtime in this area, until we organised the Clubs to take on this role. Again, some Clubs were fantastic while others left it to others to cover for them. We have asked the Clubs their preferred way forward for 2009 and we will again be allocating Clubs to run the Tech Benches in 2009.

The demise of Shawsportz then hit the headlines affecting a number of our Clubs; numerous meetings were held and attended. The cost of the facilities rose and extra tasks were required to run the BP Turf facilities. The BCC supported the centres, but the management was by and large the responsibility of the users. KWSHC continued to run the Canteen and Bar and assisted with general maintenance and operations. Our Clubs learnt very quickly how to open up and work the watering and lights. We are still working with the BCC in conjunction with BHA and KWSHC to find a Management Plan to move forward at BP and hope to have this finalised in December.

Our Constitution Committee had another busy season, holding numerous meetings. The Constitution is undergoing a major overhaul and we hope to have something to Clubs early next year. Thank you to Ronda Nix and her team for all their work in this.

Annette Stouter in her second year on Management worked closely with Aimee Eckermann and BHA to create a new format with our President's Medal (Turf) Dinner. As a joint venture with BHA at the SHC, the event looked and felt different, while there were some teething problems, the event was well supported and enjoyed. With this years experience behind us, we hope that the joint event will be bigger and better in 2009. Thank you to Annette, Aimee and Bis (BHA) for all their work on this. The grass dinner was a much slicker production and reverted to a sit down meal enjoyed by all.

Our Development Department was at full swing this year, and achieved outstanding results, with many State Championship wins. Sharyn continued to work tirelessly to ensure we have up to date programs and opportunities for all members. The start of the year saw Cathy Taylor-Alt as our RDO, but she moved to a position at Hockey Queensland in April and Regie Fisher joined the team. Regie has become an integral part of this vibrant team and worked to achieve great results in our U7 & U9 area. This area was moved from Rasey Park to Dorrington in 2008 due to field maintenance work at Rasey. What was to be a short 4 week stint ended in the full season away from Rasey. This did have a major impact on our financial bottom line - with no canteen income, but North's Management were great in the assistance with this program, we look forward to the return of these youngsters to Rasey in 2009. Sue Barsby took on many roles this year, working as admin support for development, organising tours and uniforms, supplying the canteen and bar, deliveries and collections of everything from trophies to uniforms, managing the database and any other miscellaneous task asked of her. She is greatly valued for the many and varied tasks she takes on for BWA.

With Mary unavailable the office needed to restructure some of our procedures and reorganise workloads. Aimee took on a greater role in recording and invoicing and worked with Karen Hickling to produce new spreadsheets to facilitate this. Karen's help was also invaluable in checking Club fee payment forms. We could not have made it through the season without her help. Taking over the bulk of financial work was a huge learning experience for me, with assistance from Mary and Lisa- Maree we balanced the season, although there were a few hick-cups which are detailed in the Treasurers report.

We continue to have gatherings of our Life and Past Members in our Clubhouse during the season. Opening Day at Downey Park is always special and enjoyed by our Life Members and supporters. Birthdays are normally the best reason to have a get together and it was great to see so many people attend these informal get togethers. Joyce Proctor and Elma Brennd are working to continue restoring and recording our history and we thank them for this work. Many of our members feel the joy of childbirth, engagements and marriages during the year and we congratulate you on these. On the other hand we also lose many loved ones or experience great loss for many reasons our condolences and thoughts go to all members who have suffered in this way.

BWA continues to grow and time becomes more precious. I cannot thank enough the people who continue to give so much time to our Association on a volunteer basis. Thank you to all our Management, Committees and Officials this year your support has been appreciated in this most difficult year.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Well, what can I say, the financial year in October started smoothly...

All planning was completed, we had a bumper financial year in 2007 (through the SHC Canteen and Bar), all the budgets were completed and everything looked good.

Then the start of 2008 saw Mary a little unwell, as always she brushed this off and soldiered on. The BCC had undertaken work at Rasey Park in the off-season with the anticipated completion date in March ready for our season, this was

then moved back to May, so temporary plans made to move the U7 & U9's to another facility at no field hire cost to BWA. By the time Rasey Park was ready, the season was over and we had a year of no Rasey Park canteen income and people moving between Dorrington Park and Downey Park, so the overall DP Canteen income was reduced.

Then a minor disaster Mary really was sick and not at Downey Park. While I was familiar with all Mary's roles in regard to the finance, I had never been responsible for the bottom line. Taking over the balancing through to profit and loss was not difficult, but having the extra time to broker better deals and manage our results meant re-arranging the office tasks, but unfortunately a number of areas just had to be let go. Aimee took over many of the daily data entry tasks and worked with Karen Hickling and the database to streamline the recording of Umpire, Technical Officials, Turf and Sports Trainer payments. Karen also took over the major task of checking all Club Fees Balance Sheets - a mammoth task, which she did behind the scenes, which took an enormous load off my shoulders, thank you Karen for this assistance.

The lack of Rasey Park income, was not budgeted for and the full effect not felt until near the end of the season. This together with two washed out Saturdays, the increase in the minimum canteen wage (as per the Award) saw probably our worst result in years from the canteen and this result plus the depreciation of assets is reflected in the Nett loss for the Association in 2008. Having said this our association is still in a strong financial position. We still have more Cash on Hand than we had in 2005, so while the result is a loss we are still in a secure position.

We were also affected by increased pricing at BP due to the collapse of Shawspartz, reduced Junior numbers, the need to pay the Time Steward at Downey Park and some Technical Officials on Turf before we organised Clubs to do this task. The increased workload in the office also meant fewer Grant Applications were done and during all this the price of everything increased, as we all know, due to the economy.

From her hospital bed, Mary continued to be involved and finalised the GST each month and placed all Canteen orders. The full audited accounts of our books are at the end of this Annual Report.

Now that the season is over, more work has been done on streamlining processes, looking at Grant opportunities and at our costs going forward. We have already been advised that Turf Hire at the SHC will increase and after many years of maintaining our fees, we will have to increase them to cover the spiralling general costs that the association is responsible for electricity, water, phone etc.

While the above seems a bit gloomy, it should be noted that the weekly bar takings at Downey rose during 2008, with more people coming upstairs on a Saturday afternoon to have a drink and something to eat. This is a great social thing to do and I hope it continues to grow in 2009.

Thank you to Denise, Joyce and Jenny and the band of members who stayed behind to assist Denise when closing. Special thanks to Caroline, Bud and Wendy for all their work behind the bar at functions. To Nerieada and her young workers for their efforts, hopefully with Rasey back online in 2009 we will return to our bigger and better Canteen results.

The Clubs on a whole, paid their accounts on time, with few Debtors at the end of the season and it is anticipated that all Clubs will have finalised their accounts in October.

The Summer Competition continues to be popular and allows for Cash Flow during the Summer season.

To our major suppliers and supporters: Just Hockey, Schweppes, Four'n 20, PDF, Canteen Supplies and Streets thank you for your support throughout the year. Thanks to the BCC for their assistance with the redevelopment of Rasey Park and ground works at Downey Park it is greatly appreciated, thanks also to the State Government for their funding of Goal Nets during 2008.

To Mary, Bev and Lisa thank you for your support during this busy learning year for me.

COMPETITIONS - FIXTURE & GRADING PORTFOLIO

TURF

2008 has been another busy year for our turf teams. The mix of State Hockey Centre and Redcliffe/Burringbar Park has had a spread of split rounds for all Clubs. Running from Redcliffe or Burringbar Park to the State Hockey Centre so that players and officials can be there for their Clubs first or second teams' game has resulted in a lot of extra miles being covered this season.

This year we continued with 8 teams in Division 1, 3 and 5 and 10 teams in Division 2 and 4, totalling 44 teams.

Turf fixtures commenced on Friday 14 March with fields at the State Hockey Centre and Burringbar Park being used before the juniors commenced their fixtures in April. Nine timeslots were required for Division 1 and 2 on Saturdays with thirteen on Sundays needed for Division 3, 4 and 5 games.

MONDAY MASTERS

Monday Masters competition continued with two divisions made of 7 teams in division 1 and 9 teams in division 2. All teams recorded wins and both divisions were hotly contested. Both finals were played at State Hockey Centre, Norths winning Division 2 and Kedron Wavell defeated Ascot in the division 1 game going to drop offs and then strokes. Everyone enjoyed the hospitality afterwards with the presentations being held in the Clubhouse.

DOWNEY PARK - GRASS

Numbers were down for the grass divisions this year with 48 teams affiliating and this was made up of 2 divisions of 6, 2 divisions of 9, 1 division of 10 and 1 division of 8. Grass fixtures commenced on Saturday 31 March and there was a couple of Saturdays washed out due to rain. Management was concerned with the condition of the fields and these games were set down as drawn.

All divisions were very competitive with a couple of teams not registering wins, but they all had a couple of draws.

Next season we are endeavouring to put in a couple of wet days, so there will be some Sunday games if needed.

Presidents Cup was not held this year due to the large number of Inter-City, National and International games held during the season. The teams leading at

the end of Round 1 were named the Presidents Cup winners and the player from the two top teams who would have played in the Presidents Cup game and was leading in the points became a member of the Presidents Thirteen.

With 108 teams in our competition this year, seven teams were Minor Premiers and Premiers in their division. No team was undefeated in the round games. Out of the thirteen President's Cup winners, six teams went on to be Minor Premiers as well as Premiers in their division.

Our representative season commenced with Southern Cross competition where both Brisbane teams, "Swifts" and "Scorpions" played in the final with the Swifts taking out the trophy. Our Premier League and Open teams both won their respective divisions, which ensure we have 2 teams back in Premier league in 2009. The success continued with our U15/1 and U18/1 teams also winning their Division One State Championship title. To fully appreciate the depth of talent with our teams, it is necessary to not overlook the results achieved by all of our Representative teams. In particular our U13/1 and U13/2 teams were placed 2nd and 3rd in Division One, U15/2 team 5th in Division One and U18/2 team played in Division two final only losing after drop-off and 2nd round Penalty strokes. Fortunately, their high placing has secured a Division One position for 2009.

Our teams' successes would not be possible without the hard work, time and expertise provided by our Support personnel, Coaches, Managers and Selectors every year. PROPERTY & FACILITIES PORTFOLIO REPORT

Fortune again worked against us this year with regards to access to the fields. Council works at Rasey Park were not completed within the anticipated time frames, resulting in the fields being unavailable for the entire season. Junior games were played at Dorrington Park, with a subsequent loss to BWA from anticipated turnover from Rasey Park canteen. Rasey Park BCC works, and the required field rehabilitation, have been completed and fields are ready for competition in 2009. Slightly higher rainfalls over summer and the early part of winter, careful scheduling of games to rotate field usage, and the efforts of John Bigg and Noala Gordon in managing the fields at Downey Park combined to provide for improved field maintenance for the duration of the season.

Heavy rainfalls required the cancellation of competition on two weekends. One weekend cancellation involved limited notice to Clubs as junior competition was not being held and BWA board members were not present earlier in the morning to advise of local conditions. Factors influencing limited notice have been identified and a Property & Facilities representative will be present at Downey Park prior to 11am on days when junior competition is not scheduled and wet weather a possibility to ensure timely notification to Clubs of any proposed cancellation. Rescheduling of rain-cancelled fixtures has been catered for in the proposed calendar for 2009.

BWA initiated a meeting with Softball to discuss issues related to the handover of fields at the end/beginning of the respective sports seasons, to resolve concerns about the location/placement and potential risks of covers left on the fields from the softball competition, and to determine strategies to ensure good grass coverage over gravel areas on fields 4 and 5. An alternative cover is to be implemented in the 2009 season, a formal handover of fields completed and an improved communication between both associations regarding proposed works (construction of an equipment shed by Softball and joint management of field maintenance, particularly field 7 which is affected by subsidence.)

The removal of the large mound of dirt behind field 1 has resulted in a much-improved appearance and easier retrieval of balls. Many thanks to John Bigg for coordinating this work.

This off-season sees us with the challenge of progressing a number of issues including irrigation requirements, following up on correspondence with the local BCC member & BCC Facility Planning personnel and our priority for access to BCC funds available for sporting field rehabilitation. Installation of a water tank for the toilets remains a topic for consideration, as does the goal box replacement program.

The use of the Clubhouse for dinners/presentations has identified some shortcomings in the audio-visual system & in the available storage & solutions to these problems are currently under investigation.

Thanks to Nerieada Gill our wonderful Canteen Convenor who has maintained a spectacular quality of hamburger for yet another year, and has managed staffing numbers and hours through an uncertain season with sales missing from Rasey Park and reduced at Downey Park. Thanks also to the canteen workers for their willingness to take on general housekeeping tasks around the canteen and toilets to keep the professional appearance of the facilities. Thanks go to Denise Byrne, Wendy Proctor, Angela "Bud" Coleman & Caroline Schomberg for their care of the bar. Thanks again to everyone who helped me out as the new caretaker convenor during the season, especially the Junior Women's Committee members who shouldered responsibility for setting up weekly for the season.

Thanks also to Karin Walduck and the Board of Management for supporting me in my tentative efforts to fill the shoes of Bronwyn Morris, who left the position vacant due to interstate work commitments. Finally thanks again to all the members of the P & F Committee; Bev Broadfoot, John Bigg, Robyn Sneddon, Jenny Tidey, Caroline Schomberg, Joyce Proctor & especially Mary Cockings.
