PRESIDENT'S REPORT

An annual report is always an opportunity to reflect on the many achievements, successes and challenges that we have faced throughout the year. These are also detailed elsewhere in this report but it gives me much pleasure to be able to highlight some of them here.

Once again we can be proud of our many achievements during the year:

- Ran hockey fixture competitions for juniors, seniors and masters, on turf and on grass, for over 3129 registered players. Fortunately this year the weather was kind to us and fixtures ran (almost) without a hitch.
- Sent 24 teams to compete at State Championships for Premier League, Opens, U18, U15, U13 and Masters and U11 Southern Cross
- Hosted the Women's Premier League and Open Championships at the State Hockey Centre
- Continued to work with Brisbane Hockey Association (BHA) and Kedron Wavell Services Hockey Club (KWSHC) to administer the Brisbane Hockey Management Group (BHMG) which was established to run the Burringbar Turf Facility. This year we have replaced the synthetic turf surface, appointed Tony Drinkwater as facility supervisor and are in the process of upgrading the dugouts and technical bench facility – no small feat!
- Continued the free-to-air telecast of Division 1 Hockey through QCTV each week, in conjunction with BHA.
- Completed the draft of the new Operations Manual (including the Policies and Procedures) that has been sent out to clubs for comment before final approval. This follows on from the work done during 2010 to review and update our constitution.

Areas for us to continue to focus on in the next year include:

- BWA Strategic Plan – we need to be very clear and committed in our planned activities, to ensure we use our limited resources (people and their time, operating budget) to maximum advantage.
- Continue the planning for a turf surface at Downey Park, together with upgrading storage and toilet facilities.
- Greater promotion of the benefits of QCTV coverage. We have not exploited the potential sponsorship capabilities of this medium nor looked at greater use of the telecasts for ongoing coaching of players, coaches, umpires and commentators.
- Volunteer management – the number of people prepared and able to commit to the many volunteer duties needed to run our organisation seems to dwindle every year. Even when paid positions are offered it is often still difficult to fill them. And every position that needs to be filled with a paid employee, because we do not have available volunteers, inevitably leads to an increase in costs to players.

In spite of the occasional challenges and difficulties we can be very proud of our achievements. In closing I would particularly like to thank all the members of my management committee for their efforts, consideration, passion and good humour. To our dedicated volunteers – thank you, because without you we would not be able to exist. And last but not least my sincere thanks to Kath Proctor and all the BWA staff for their ongoing support and hard work.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

2011 has come and gone so quickly, each year seems to travel faster, whether this is to do with age or technology I am not sure. Again the wet weather hit Queensland and the great South East and while Downey Park was threatened, our pro-active disaster management strategies meant we only had limited disruption. Unfortunately this cannot be said for those communities who experienced terrible loss of life and facilities. Our thoughts and prayers have been with them.

While we did not experience a major disaster as in 2009, we did lose power for a week and a number of fields were affected due to the weather and outside events. Field 1 was damaged during the floods and, eventually needed a full re-construction, thankfully the Brisbane City Council (BCC) assisted with this through the disaster scheme and Field 7 and Field 10 struggled through the season with significant areas damaged by water and vandals. This field damage combined with the resignation of long-term casual groundsman John Bigg made a large workload for Meg Brodie who managed the Property and Facilities portfolio for BWA. Life Member Noala Gordon who has long assisted with the Property and Facilities area worked and volunteered to assist throughout the year. We also engaged John Robinson on contract work to ensure the fields were to the best standard possible each week. A full report on all the activities in

this portfolio are found later in the Annual Report. We hope to meet with Brisbane Softball and the BCC in the near future to finalise an annual maintenance plan for Downey Park.

The lack of Field 1 did put a strain on our income streams with both the canteen and bar takings down from previous years. In past years many people would buy lunch or a drink and sit and watch the game being played on Field 1 either from the tables on the grass or the veranda. Hopefully with Field 1 back up and running in 2012 people will again purchase from the canteen and bar before leaving Downey Park. To try and provide an incentive for teams to come up to the clubhouse at the end of the fixture season all grass teams were given a plate of food to enjoy with a cold drink. Most teams availed themselves to this initiative, hopefully a similar event will be held in 2012.

BWHA planning took place in October to December of 2010, providing calendars, budgets and directions for 2011. After consultation with clubs on a number of issues it was decided not to hold any dinners in 2011, but incorporate the awards on Grand Final days. We also determined to continue working closely with BHA on areas of common involvement: joint finals, competitions and use of venues, player and coach development. Once our Board of Management for 2011 was elected at the AGM, portfolios were determined and members prepared for the busy year ahead.

During this period we continued to run Summer Hockey, Jenny Heron and Kathryn Duggan ensured draws, workers and umpires were organised to allow people to enjoy hockey in a social and fun environment.

The database continued to be a problem as it cannot provide usable reports or information. Hopefully Hockey Australia will soon come to a decision on what to do with this program which has little suitability to BWHA. Sue Barsby worked hard to produce the draws using the system and Chris Carr entered all information each week.

Significant changes occurred at Hockey Queensland during the early part of the year when long standing General Manager, Garry West-Bail retired from the position. His replacement Kim Guerin has invited many opportunities to revisit procedures. We hope one of these will be the database. If Hockey Queensland finally start using the database as the Associations have been directed to, they may begin to fully understand the limitations and problems we have experienced for the past 5 years and some solution could be found.

BHMG who BWHA is a part of, worked tirelessly through the off-season to secure funding and then organise replacement of the turf at Burringbar. The turf surface was no longer playable and thankfully the Department of Communities (Sport and Recreation) approved a grant to upgrade the surface and facilities. This was vital as the 4 turf facilities in Brisbane are all fully utilised, being without Burringbar Park turf could have resulted in tremendous problems for the playing of fixtures in 2011. The turf was laid in the pre-season and ready for the commencement of fixtures. Well done to all involved. We are still working on the infrastructure upgrades which we hope will be ready for the 2012 season.

Sonya Fisher has been working very hard in gaining grants for our Association. She is constantly on the lookout for opportunities from the BCC, State Government and the Gambling Funds. We have been successful in a number of grants and should have Solar Panels installed by the end of 2011 – well done Sonya.

Jenny Heron continued in her area of Fixtures and Gradings, working with multiple committees and people within BWHA and BHA to co-ordinate fixtures, venues and finals. This is a huge area of our sport. The problems with the database fixture templates, the numerous requests for upgrading and changes to fixtures as well as liaising with BHA means this is a very large job. Jenny continues to handle this area with professionalism and impartiality, thank you Jenny for all your hard work.

Coupled with this was Desley Mackay who took on the role of Match Secretary checking clubs stayed within the rules of our fixtures. This is a huge job. It has now been identified that as the Association has grown we now need a person to look after each area: Grass, Turf, Masters. Hopefully in 2012 we can achieve this. Desley put in many hours to try to cover off on all clubs and teams, but again with limited reports available from the database, this task was nearly impossible. Thank you to Desley for the hours you put in each week.

BWHA continued to liaise with BHA to provide hockey on free to air TV. We again paid for weekly games to be telecast on Bris 31. Lisa Jones had the logistical nightmare of organising the BWHA side of commentary staff each fortnight and ensuring team lists and information were available for the technical officials and commentators. Well done Lisa and your band of regular and guest commentators. I believe we are the only Association in Australia providing this type of service to our members. Thank you also to Ronda Nix and her technical officials.

Our representative teams again were very successful at all levels. We are lucky to have such a great Development Team of Sharyn, Sue and Regie creating opportunities for our player and coach development. Our Vice-President Lisa Jones was also heavily involved in this area. It takes much organisation and planning to allow so many people to be involved at representative levels, so congratulations to our Development Team for a job well done. Thank you to all selectors, who give up many hours watching fixtures and trials to select the best teams possible, and to our volunteer coaches, managers and umpires who travel with the teams. Full details of the results follow in this report.

In 2011 we hosted the Women's Premier League and Open Tournament at the SHC. Helen Sharp was appointed the BWA Championship Convenor and Ronda Nix the Tournament Director. BWA was given permission to run a BBQ to help provide adequate food for the participants and to try and offset the cost of the tournament. Thank you to Sue Barsby and the many volunteers who assisted with this. Well done to all workers, supporters and team personnel.

Thank you to Lesley Bennett and Sonya Fisher for their tireless efforts in the Umpires and Technical area and to the Committee who constantly strive for improvement across this area of our sport. Thank you to our mentors in particular Jan Hadfield whose assistance and guidance is always appreciated. In 2011 we reimbursed most of our technical officials on senior turf fixtures, thank you to Lesley for doing the allocations and to Kathryn for organising the recording and payments. We are looking to have a revamped "home base" for our umpires at Downey Park in 2012 thanks to the generous bequest of Dr Mary Hughes. The former office under the clubhouse will be set up to provide a training and meeting area for our Downey Park umpires. We hope this will create an atmosphere of support and development which will benefit all.

Thank you also to Lesley Bennett for all her work in the Masters Gradings and Fixtures and to Ros Julien and her committee for working on developing the Masters area of our association. This is an area of our sport which is growing steadily and has a wealth of knowledge, experience and talent that we need to tap into. Hopefully this committee will be able to fully utilise this great resource we have in our sport.

Our Junior Committee continue to do a great job, organising and providing quality hockey for children aged 4+ to 17. Debbie Wark and her committee should be proud of all they achieve each year. The boys again played their U11 Coulter Shield with the U11 Southern Cross at Downey Park. This was a great day and ran very smoothly through the efforts of the Junior and Development Committees. The Junior Section of this report highlights the many achievements of our Junior Committee.

Chris Blanchard has after a very long year completed the draft of the new Operations Manual (including the Policies and Procedures) this will be sent out to clubs for comment before final approval. Hopefully this will provide an easy to use format for all members ready for season 2012. Well done Chris, I am sure you will be happy when it is completed.

Melda Dunning worked closely with Kathryn Austen in the office on Events including finals, tournaments and awards. Melda also worked with BWA and our Sports Trainers to provide the best service possible for fixtures. Good work Melda.

Annette Stouter was also on management, but a change in her work commitments, limited her ability to work on a portfolio. Annette continued to show great support for the Board of Management, her clear thinking and genuine desire to improve the service we provide our members was greatly appreciated. Her sense of humour and fun is always valuable on any committee.

Joyce Proctor, Elma Brennand and Shirley Otto continued to spend countless hours working through our archives. They are always looking for more information. Karin, Jenny T, Joyce, Caroline, Bud, Mary, Ian and Rhonda all assisted at Downey Park, either in the Canteen, Bar, Uniforms or Control Room, we have truly great volunteers. Margie (Canteen) and Denise (Bar) provided quality service and goods to our members each Saturday, thank you for all your hard work. To our many casual workers on Saturday, thank you. A special thanks to Charlie in the Saturday Office and Sharon her mum who filled in when Charlie was not available. Thank you to Mary & Bev who continue to assist out of hours opening and closing the clubhouse for outside bookings.

I would like to thank the many volunteers at club and Association level. Our Association cannot survive without you, from the smallest task to the large roles all are important. While recognition of some volunteers does happen, for most it is a labour of love and commitment. It is difficult to single out individuals who work hard for hockey as we have so many great volunteers.

To our President Dr Karin Walduck my heartfelt thanks, she has again lead by example. Her ability to think logically and strategically makes her a wonderful asset to the Association. How she fits it all into her schedule I don't know, but she continues to provide advanced leadership and enthusiasm to our Board of Management and Association.

Congratulations also to our latest Life Member, Caroline Schomberg. Caroline has worked tirelessly for BWA for over 20 years, primarily in umpiring and on the House Committee, volunteering on many occasions to work behind the bar at functions and events. Caroline was welcomed as a Life member at our 2010 Annual General Meeting.

Many of our members feel the joy of childbirth, engagements and marriages during the year and we congratulate you on these. On the other hand we also lose many loved ones or experience great loss for many reasons our condolences and thoughts go to all members who have suffered in this way.

BWA continues to grow and time becomes more precious. I cannot thank enough the people who continue to give so much time to our Association on a volunteer basis. Thank you to all our Management, Committees and Officials this year your support has been appreciated you can be justly proud of your achievements.

A special thank you also to our staff who work above and beyond the call of duty. They are all passionate hockey people and it is this passion that ensures that their role at BWA is not just a job but a commitment to the sport we all love.

TREASURER'S REPORT

I would like to acknowledge the work done by the BWA office and in particular, Kath Proctor, that has allowed the smooth operation of the Association in 2011. The Association is very professionally managed and it is a credit to our hard working staff. This is highlighted by both the completion of the Financial Statements in a timely and satisfactory manner and the continued strong financial position of the Association. Well done ladies!

A summary of the 2011 Financial Performance of the Association follows:

- Profit \$35,348 - on an adjusted basis profit was \$39,848 and was an 8% increase on 2010 (a 2010 invoice for \$4,500 was not received until 2011 so was paid out of 2011 income)
- Net Assets \$670,905 – increased 13% (but includes remaining Dr Mary Hughes Bequest funds of \$43,818 in a Reserve Fund that will be used to develop facilities and umpires at Downey Park after \$6,181 was expended in 2011 on a new awning & blinds in the clubhouse)
- Income \$1,273,877 – increased by 7% and Expenses \$1,194,711 – reduced by 4%
 - Canteen sales fell 12% but there was a 14% reduction in canteen purchases
 - Donation of \$5k to Warwick Hockey Association to assist their post-flood recovery
 - Electricity costs increased by 28% which in 2012 should be reduced as a result of a Queensland Government grant received (post 30 Sept 2011) of \$10,579 to install a 1.5KW Solar Electricity system (due before 31 December 2011)
 - Repairs expenditure increased 300% but recognizes the work undertaken at Downey and Rasey Parks in 2011 (a certain amount of work needs to be undertaken annually to meet our obligations under our lease from the Council)
 - QCTV arrangements at a cost of \$19,500 were continued

Grants - we will continue to submit grant applications wherever possible, to assist replace assets, upgrade facilities, improve operations and deliver sustainable solutions for the Association.

COMPETITIONS PORTFOLIO REPORTS

COMPETITIONS: FIXTURES & GRADING

TURF

For the first time since turf fixtures began, Divisions 1, 2 and 3 were played on a Saturday and Divisions 4 & 5 on a Sunday in 2011. The mix of the State Hockey Centre, Redcliffe, Burringbar Park and Tiger Turf - Eastern Suburbs Hockey fields at Carina has resulted in another busy year for clubs playing at multiple venues each weekend.

This year BWA continued with all turf divisions fielding 10 teams. The turf season commenced in early March, fifteen timeslots were required for the Saturday competition and ten on Sundays to cater for all games.

With the new surface at Burringbar Park the turf was used to a greater capacity. Jointly BWA and BHA used the State Hockey Centre with 1 field each on both Saturday and Sunday and a rotation of the other venues at BP, Redcliffe and Easts.

MONDAY MASTERS

Three new teams were added to our Monday Masters competition which gave us 24 teams in total. Having three divisions meant that each division played at a separate venue each week, State Hockey Centre, Redcliffe, Burringbar Park and Easts Hockey Tiger Turf with the MM division 2 which had eight teams split each week. During the season a "club" night was held so that clubs could support their other Monday Masters teams and this was thoroughly enjoyed by all involved. All teams recorded wins and all divisions were hotly contested. All finals were played at State Hockey Centre and the results are in the records section of this report.

DOWNEY PARK – GRASS

This year a decision was made to continue with 10 teams in each division where possible, with only 48 teams affiliating, Downey Park 1, 2, 4, 5 made up the four divisions of 10 teams and Downey Park 3 with 8 teams allowing room for extra affiliations if needed. Some teams struggled to have a win but all teams had draws and as such had points at the end of the season.

Presidents Cup was not held again this year due to the large number of Inter-City, National and International games held during the season. The teams leading at the end of Round 1 were named the President's Cup winners. Due to all the constraints re time, venues and player availability BWA is looking at not awarding President's cup trophies in the future.

122 teams made up our competition this year, an increase of 1 from 2010, 4 teams were Minor Premiers and Premiers in their division. All divisions were hotly contested with no team recording zero points.

Thank you to all the ladies who were on the BWA Fixture & Grading Committees for a job well done. Hope to see you back next year.

COMPETITION: OPERATIONS

UMPIRES

It was another big year for BWA umpires. Thank you to our Turf and Grass umpire stewards Sonya Fisher and Robyn Sutherland who did a tremendous job with the umpire allocations. With 49 games each fixture weekend, (25 turf and 24 grass) it was a huge task to find umpires for the 18 weeks of fixtures, plus finals. Without umpires there wouldn't be any games. Thank you to all umpires who give so much more of their time. Every player sat a rules paper this year, the aim of which was to educate players and hopefully make the umpire's job easier.

This year Jan Hadfield conducted 2 rules talks for turf umpires and Lyn Cowie-McAlister delivered a rules talk for grass umpires. These sessions are always entertaining and informative. Gaye Henderson again made herself available at Downey Park on one Saturday a month to hold information sessions for umpires. The new automatic 2 minute green and 5 minute yellow card suspension was introduced throughout all senior games. Fears that players would have problems adjusting were not realised as they quickly got used to leaving the field and taking their seat so their suspension could start as soon as possible.

Every year BWA sends umpires to State Championships and the number of umpires volunteering to give up their time for the Opens and vets weekends, and the longer U18, U15 and U13 tournaments was lower this year.

Congratulations go to Bernie Pangrazio for achieving her Australian umpires badge at the U21 National Championships.

TECHNICAL

BWA this year had paid qualified technical staff on Turf games instead of rostering clubs each week. Thank you to everyone for a wonderful job of keeping the games running efficiently and on time. Cheryl Kann gave up her time on Saturday afternoons to keep an eye on Downey Park and sort out any troubles as they arose.

This year BWA also sent a technical official, Sarah Shepperd to the Vets State Championships where she was awarded her Queensland Judges Certificate.

The U&TC, which consisted of Ronda Nix, Lesley Bennett, Cheryl Kann, Lyn Thomas, Robyn Sutherland, Gaye Henderson, Pam Nitarski and Caroline Schomberg, met regularly throughout the season. Thank you for volunteering your time.

MASTERS

To enable maximum game time this year Masters players had to get used to 2 minutes at half time and 3 minutes between games. While the 2 minutes at half time was achievable, the short time between games was a bit of a struggle especially if a team had supplied 2 umpires and technical personnel to the previous game. The players are to be congratulated on their ability to adapt.

The competition each year continues to improve, with MM Division 1 of a very high standard. There were uneven numbers of teams in each division which made the draw difficult as the fixture committee of Robyn Andersen, Lesley Bennett and Caroline Schomberg tried to arrange teams from the same club playing at the same venue, which was difficult when there are 3 divisions and 4 venues in use each week.

The Masters Organising Committee chaired by Ros Julien held regular meetings throughout the year and conducted a forum in July where issues that were of concern to masters players were raised.

We also hope that some changes to the By-Laws (in the new Operations Manual) will also provide more consistent, workable and appropriate rules for our association.

DATABASE REPORT – SPORTING PULSE

Once again, Hockey Australia sprung a new major system update for us to deal with at the beginning of our playing season. The arrangement of Clubs entering player information into the database was deactivated and all players had to register themselves online. This was an improvement to the system, as we are able to access more information and directly from the player, but with the playing season less than 2 months away, every player had to be re-entered into the database which caused issues. I thank the Clubs for their patience and understanding in those hectic days leading up to the first game of the season. Hopefully there are no surprises in January 2012 when we start registering our players for the upcoming season.

Chris Carr, as our Data Entry Assistant, continued to enter every match result and team statistics each week. Some Clubs had to be reminded to enter players throughout the season when new players joined their club, but overall clubs kept the database up to date. Chris had most match results entered within 48 hours of games being played, depending on when the information was sent from turf facilities, a job well done and appreciated. This year very few fines were issued, thank you to the club database personnel for updating the database on time and for clubs chasing up any match sheets that weren't submitted.

Two of our biggest concerns (still) with the database are the lack of reporting information we can obtain from the system and the payment of Umpires. The reporting information is one area Sporting Pulse in Melbourne could not fix. The Umpires payments are supposed to be linked to our fixtures for automatic calculation of each individual umpire payment but this is still a work in progress. Hopefully in 2012 we can overcome these issues and have some smooth running for a change.

REGIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR (RCD)

The season kicked off as usual with Southern Cross League held in early February with both Brisbane teams competing and Brisbane "Swifts" winning. The Southern Cross league format this year was a round robin competition, no finals and was played over two weekends. The players had to endure extreme heat on the last day in Toowoomba. The rationale for the League is constantly being evaluated due partly to the regulated participation of the Scorcher Squad members as a means of monitoring their workload. However, I believe it still fulfils an important role for our club, representative and particularly state U18 players with early preparation for the season and National Championships. I would like to acknowledge and thank Jenny Heron who will be retiring from the Southern Cross committee. Jenny has served many years on the committee ensuring BWA player interests are well represented.

Our representative teams have achieved many creditable results in 2011. The highlight would have to be the strong performances of our U15 teams at the Championships in Maryborough. Congratulations to all involved and special congratulations to Brisbane 1 who were successful in winning our only Division 1 State Championship for 2011. We were successful in maintaining our 2 teams in Premier League and the Open team winning 2nd division.

Our teams' successes would not be possible without the hard work, time and expertise provided by our Support personnel, Coaches, Managers and Selectors dedicate every year. I am hugely indebted to all of you and thank you always for your continued assistance and for putting up your hand to "have a go".

Congratulations to all those players who gained recognition by being selected in Australian and Queensland Teams and Squads during the year. Particular mention to Alyssa Kerr, Audrey Smith, Jasmine Larosa and Murphy Allendorf who have gained selection in National Junior squads. The names of these players will appear in the records section of the annual report. The chart below represents the number of talented identified BWA players selected for Queensland.

The following development opportunities occurred in 2011:

- BWA provided specialist sessions for our talent identified U13, U15, U18 and U21 players assisting them with their preparation for respective National Championships and Camps.
- BWA players provided important match practice against our state U13, U18, U16 Secondary Schoolgirls.
- Our Selection trials and development programs were conducted in March/April and July. The numbers involved are outlined in table below. Our programs always attract good numbers and we were able to provide most nominated players with the opportunity to represent Brisbane or another centre at the respective Championships.

- BWA invited guest speakers Barry Vohland and Des King to a Selectors workshop conducted in March to assist clubs and representative selectors with the often daunting task of selecting.
- Specialist Goalkeeping coaching during U11 Development and Selection Program.
- 3 x Hockey Queensland Coaching Conferences held in March, June and November 2010.
- BWA have entered teams into the Brisbane Indoor Hockey Competition in Division 1 and Division 2.

The above programs are well supported by the many participation and recruitment programs conducted by Regina Fisher, BWA Development Officer e.g. Active After School Programs, HookN2Hockey, Hockey in the Park, and many school development programs. Regie is also responsible for our successful Rookey U7 & U9 competition, U7 & U9 skills day and U11 development and selection programs.

The Future - 2012

After serving over 10 years as General Manager of Hockey Queensland Garry West-Bail resigned from the position in early March. Hockey Queensland appointed Kim Guerin to the position that has instigated and indicated that important changes will take place in the key areas of player and coach development in 2012.

One such change will be the introduction and trialling of a zone based "Super League" competition in 2012 replacing the current Premier League format. The proposed competition comprises of 6 zonal teams, North Queensland, Central Queensland, Wide Bay, Darling Downs/Ipswich, Brisbane, and South Coast.

Other changes for 2012 are as follows:

- The current Southern Cross Competition held for our U18, U15 and U13 teams will be conducted over 2 Sundays with full length games.
- BWA will be conducting U13 development programs prior to U13 Selection trials very similar to the very successful U11 program format currently conducted.
- 4 x BWA U15 teams will be participating in the State Championships in 2012 and future Championships.
- Hockey Australia have made significant changes to the HockeyEd program with a greater emphasis on "face to face" delivery and more practical content. Plans are already in place for BWA and BHA to conduct, 2 x Level 1 (Beginner) and 1 x Level 2 (Development) courses in 2012.

Summary

I would firstly like to thank Lisa Jones, BWHA Vice President, for her tireless and enormous support to the development department. Lisa coached Southern Cross league, Premier League and U18 teams in 2011 and contributions are always respected and valued greatly by myself.

Thank-you to all members of Management for their continued support and tireless efforts in 2011.

My last thanks go to work mates Kathy Proctor, Kathryn Austen, Sue Barsby and Regie Fisher for ensuring our work environment remains supportive, fun and professional. Our shared passion for the game remains always in the forefront of our work environment.

TURF UMPIRES' STEWARD REPORT

In 2011, over 290 different umpires were used across the five turf divisions which I am sure would be a record!!

I would particularly like to thank the umpires who did more than 10 games each during the season – you are a special bunch. There are just over 10 of you and **luckily** most are from different clubs as without you we would not be able to run our competition – so thanks.

Thanks also to those umpires who said yes when I rang them on a Friday or (even worse) Saturday morning to do an extra game or to help out in some way. Even though it should be a club responsibility to find replacements, it invariably ends up with a phone call to me, and sometimes my partner would like me to just switch my phone off on a Saturday – maybe I will next year!

This year was as difficult as most recent years as there continues to be a discernible and increasing trend for players to be unwilling to umpire or else put such tight conditions around their availability that it is almost impossible to allocate them. The reasons given are varied and would make this report too long (and

boring) to read – but I have probably heard them all. So the Association has been lucky in 2011 to obtain the services of a few more non-playing umpires, who are much easier to allocate.

Hopefully 2012 will see a reversal in the trend and we will see more players willing to give back to their sport by using the skills and knowledge they have built up over the years to pick up a whistle and do a conscientious job of umpiring. Just like players, umpires aren't perfect – so if you don't yell or criticise someone in your team for missing a trap, please don't do the same to an umpire who has missed something that you think should have been blown! Then maybe, we will get some more volunteers who are willing to give umpiring a go.

GRASS UMPIRES STEWARD'S REPORT

During 2011, Senior Clubs at Downey Park were again required to submit a Register of Umpires which could be used as a basis to allocate at least one suitable umpire to a game corresponding to each team that they had registered in divisions DP1-5.

There was one factor that made allocation of umpires a little more difficult this year. Mostly clubs were very understanding about this unusual situation. The closure of several fields for repair resulted in games needing to be played on widespread and sometimes lower standard fields. It was not always easy getting umpires to and from fields as far apart as Field 5 and 13. Thank you if you were one who did a sprint e.g. from Field 10 to Field 4. The pain will be all worth it – the side benefit of extra fitness and a beautiful Field 1 for 2012.

Thank you to those clubs that provided lists which were able to be utilised easily and effectively because of the number of names, from a variety of teams, supplied for each level. Generally these clubs were the same ones that regularly kept in touch by supplying updates such as – changes to the teams the umpires were registered in, changes to the level that umpires could be allocated to, injuries to and unavailability of umpires, additional umpires that could be allocated. Also these clubs were often willingly developing and providing assistance to new umpires and mostly they were able to provide a back-up plan if there was some predicament – such as changes to the fixture times or fields. These clubs are to be commended. Their co-operation is greatly appreciated. Often they are clubs with 3 or 4 grass teams.

Umpires from these clubs fare better – they have fewer allocations, they are more likely to be named on games that are more convenient to their playing time or location, are less likely to be umpiring out of their depth and are more likely to be supported/supportive if there is any need for changes, whether they be from their club or the Association. They also receive assistance from their clubs if it is required.

There was however a number of clubs that provided very limited lists, even no lists at all, especially for higher grades, which resulted in regular headaches and time wasting for office staff, Association and club volunteers, trying to counteract unforeseen factors after allocations had been posted. Often the lists were outdated so umpires were inadvertently named to umpire and play at the same time, were unavailable because of injury or no longer playing, or the list was so short there was no room to provide viable alternatives when these situations occurred. These are both large and small clubs.

Umpires from these clubs generally umpire much more frequently than their club mates, sometimes at inconvenient times and locations, and often without support. There is a high risk of umpires failing to show.

Also some, mostly large, clubs continued to provide lists naming every player whether they have umpired before or not. It is enough to say that these umpires do not do well or have no option other than to 'buy' a replacement. This is hardly conducive to the development of umpires or to reducing the cost of sport i.e. out of pocket expenses to individuals, fines to the club for no-shows, stress from physical overwork of some individuals or emotional panic for others. There is again a higher risk of umpires failing to show.

Basically it seems that the middle size clubs cope better with undertaking their responsibilities of providing working Registers, developing new umpires, providing a good core group of experienced umpires and being able to supply Badged umpires for Finals. Large and small clubs have unique difficulties and mostly these are linked to the number, or lack, of players.

With that all said - Congratulations to all umpires who took up their whistle cheerfully or fearfully. It is an old chestnut but – 'we couldn't have a game without you'. I know you carried out your tasks to the best of your ability and hopefully gained something positive from every experience. Thank you all - especially

those young beginners who discovered, either by default or design that they could do this, with some going on to umpire finals and gain badges - you are worth your weight in Gold Whistles.

Finally - To see the apparent return of the culture of *bagging the umpire* is disappointing. We only have ourselves to blame. The following comments are again becoming common:-
“Club ABC always complains about umpires but their umpires are terrible”, “I don’t want to be put on the list as I don’t want to be named every week”, “*soandso* complains every week but she doesn’t umpire herself”, “*thingammy* is always complaining and she should know better being an umpire herself”, “I have to umpire every week for my club – there isn’t anyone else”, “Club XYZ are not holding up their end of the bargain - they want to play in the DP## without providing an umpire of that quality”, “why would we put good umpires on those games when we don’t get good ones in return” etc.

The solution is at hand - There are a large number of very capable umpires that are not being named on club lists and there are a large number of potential umpires who just need some support. For each older ‘retiring’ umpire who teams up with a younger beginner or two, and as part of their volunteer contribution to their club, goes out with them when they umpire. It will only take a few weeks and the umpire base will double. The rewards will be ‘older’ umpires will not need to be allocated as they are undertaking another valuable job and beginners will be more willing to ‘have a go’. Succession planning at its best.

Here’s to early, full, regular, developing, growing lists of confident, willing, supported umpires in 2012.

FACILITY AND DEVELOPMENT PORTFOLIO REPORT

2011 opened with huge floods and as always the lower areas of Downey Park were inundated. The Weather Bureau had warned of possible flooding so we purchased 2 shipping containers to protect our grounds equipment. It worked and our mowers and so on were safe out of the water but eventually both the old mowers died from over work due to the length and thickness of the grass and to their age.

We purchased a Toro zero turn mower with a 72 inch cutting pan. It has a turbo diesel motor and so now we can cut all the fields in 1 day as opposed to about 2 and a half previously. This has increased productivity immensely. At this time John Bigg, the groundsman resigned. His assistant, Noala Gordon, who is a life member of BWA, took over the mowing and associated tasks. Since then we have employed John Robinson to help with the grounds. Currently he is repairing goal boxes by welding new bases on in place of the old rusty ones.

After the flood to repair the damage from the water and BCC vehicles crossing the field, the Brisbane City Council “top dressed” field 1 with river sand. Unfortunately the sand was not spread evenly and so killed what grass that we had on the field. After much discussion and negotiation with the Brisbane City Council they finally accepted responsibility for the mess and agreed to rejuvenate the field. They sprayed to remove the weeds, top dressed with soil and laser levelled the surface then turfed with good grass. As well as all this they have put in a sprinkler system. Thank you to Kylie Dyer from the BCC for her assistance with this.

The sprinkler system is having considerable teething problems and we have yet to officially receive the field as the sprinklers tend to flood the area and are set too low on the surface. My hope is that all will be fixed before the start of the 2012 season. The low lying grounds sheds are flood prone, with flooding occurring almost every time it rains, so we are developing ways to safeguard the area and allow for hosing out after rain. Almost all of the equipment is now in the containers and we plan to turn the shed into a workshop for maintenance work.

2011 has been a difficult year due to the flooding and field 1 being out of action but I believe we have learned many lessons and with our restructuring the future for Downey Park is bright.

Prior to 2012 we hope to have a meeting with the BCC and the Brisbane Softball Association so we can better plan for the shared usage of the facility. We all love this park and need to work together to provide great sporting opportunities for all our members.

I wish to thank Mary McNeil and Ian Watt for their additional assistance in the bar and to Jenny Tidey and Joyce Proctor for keeping me on the straight and narrow and making me see sense when I get crazy ideas. My thanks also to Noala Gordon for stepping into the breach, when John Bigg resigned.

JUNIOR COMPETITIONS REPORT

19 clubs (105 teams) nominated teams into the junior competition this year. Our Grading Committee of Pam Nitarski, Sue Carey and Margie Brown worked hard to ensure that 34 turf teams and 71 grass teams nominating were placed into the appropriate divisions.

TURF

34 Teams were nominated into the JT1, JT2 and JT3 and 13T division.

In a bold effort to give all teams a season on turf, and after consulting the Constitution on ruling, the Grading Committee decided to run 7 teams in JT1, 10 teams in JT2 and 9 teams in JT3. Only 7 teams had

nominated for JT1 and after reviewing team registrations and player lists, and running one week of grading matches, it was determined that none of the JT2 clubs were strong enough to be moved up to JT1. All teams nominating in JT1 were sufficiently strong enough to warrant not moving a team to JT2 thus giving an even pool. The Grading Committee and Junior Management were also reluctant to reduce the JT1 competition to 6 teams. A survey of clubs regarding the Junior Turf competition gave feedback and this will be taken into consideration for next year's gradings.

The late withdrawal of a team from the 13T competition allowed all teams nominating for the 13T to be included this year. The team with a bye in the 13T competition played the 13A team who had a bye that week at Downey Park. The aim of this was to give both teams a game on their bye week and also to give the 13A teams an opportunity to play a stronger team in the age group and to help the 13T teams "keep in touch" with others in their age-group.

Junior Management proposed to run a President's Plate finals competition. Initially it was only for the JT2 and JT3 competition, but extended to the JT1 competition as well after feedback regarding the number of games that the JT1 teams played in their season (i.e. 12 fixture games). The aim of the President's Plate finals competition was to give the bottom half of the competition a finals round and for coaches, players the opportunity to experience finals as some teams don't get this experience.

GRASS

Once again this year, most clubs had nominated their teams into the correct division and very little moving of teams between divisions was needed. Grass grading games ran over a period of weeks with teams playing two 30 minute games each week so teams were able to be seen against the majority of others in the same division.

The JG competition had 21 teams nominate for JG1 – JG3. Only 4 teams nominated in JG1 and 10 in JG2 and 7 in JG3. This meant some juggling was required to even out the grades (JG1 x 6, JG2 x 7, JG3 x 8).

The 13 grass competition had 20 teams nominate and the 13A competition consisted of 7 teams which meant a bye for one team each week. The grading committee decided to play the 13T team with a bye that week against the 13A team with a bye – this was seen as quite successful.

30 teams nominated for U11 and the decision was made to have again U11A through to U11D. After grading games teams were settled into the grades without issues.

Overall, the season was successful. We thank the grading committee for their hard work to ensure even competition across the grades. Congratulations to those clubs who won premierships and I certainly look forward to 2012.
