PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Once again it is my pleasure to report on the performance and activities of a great association. An association made great only by the dedication and loyalty of such a fine group of people who make up the volunteers and staff of Brisbane Women's Hockey. It would be unfair to single out any particular person for special mention as the various reports on the following pages speak for themselves.

It is comforting to see such camaraderie, and mate ship developing within our subcommittees and the sense of service displayed by our staff and members. There are many reasons for all of us to feel extremely proud of our association. It is obvious that BWHA is not just a sporting group and with this in mind we have agreed to assist a local community group in 2003, The Riverside Quilters Group. This group makes quilts to support terminally ill children at our local Royal Children's Hospital. This goes to prove that we are a service organisation in more ways than one.

But it is more than that. It is teamwork. Teamwork, with exceptional leadership provided by our committee members, that has made BWHA a leading association in our sport. Many would agree the words of Lisa Carruthers, member of Australian Women's Hockey Team, 1996 Atlanta, "and the journey is the reward."

In the last year, some of the our achievements have been:

- Installation and upgrade of computers for our office
- Launch of our web site - bwha.com.au
- Winning all bar two State Championships
- The continued maintenance of three major parks in Brisbane
- Management of one of the largest single gender associations in Australia
- The receipt of grant monies to appoint a development officer
- Growth in numbers of junior and senior hockey players
- Successful hosting the U11 Southern Cross
- Significant contribution to the growing Southern Skies School Hockey Tournament
- Establishing the inaugural structured Southern Cross Hockey Committee with 'voted in' office bearers from all member associations
- The sharing of a \$600,000 facilities development grant for Downey Park for 2002 and a further shared \$600,000 for the continuing upgrade, which commenced October 2002.

With an impressive list like that you would think that we were a corporation.

With financial year-end results just to hand I can report that we have had another exceptional year. The year commenced with a commitment by Management to only increase fees by the GST component, the numbers looked tight. The additional \$20 for an umpiring levy, aided our new project. The Umpires Club started a program for turf umpiring development. There is no doubt this was an added cost, however, the draw card was if a player completed their umpiring obligations then a refund was assured. The umpiring plan looks set to continue and build from this base to expand in 2003.

With the completion of the upgrade of fields 8,11,12, 2 and 6 and the commencement in October of this year on fields 1 and 9 and March 2003 fields 4 and 5 popularly known as the "Cabbage Patch". We now have a solid foundation to take full advantage of this for the 2003 season and our 70th birthday year. Thank you to the Queensland Amateur Women's Sports Council, Thelma Crouch and the Brisbane City Council, Maureen Hayes for their assistance with the upgrading of our park and the continued support and appreciation of what Downey Park means to so many.

We are extremely excited to be hosting the State U13 Championships in June 2003, with planning meetings already well underway. I am well aware of the condemnation for holding this Championship on Downey Park. With the celebrations planned and the extended number of U13's being able to participate in a championship on a ground that

has seen many players rise to the ranks of Australian representative honours. I look forward to welcoming all associations from around Queensland to our special venue.

GOVERNANCE

BWHA is subject to more scrutiny than any other association and we are committed to the highest standards of corporate governance and transparency. We can reaffirm to you that your BWHA board prides itself on its professionalism and commerciality.

We have made important changes to our structure during the year to support our portfolios under the constitution with which we operate.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

The Annual General Meeting was held on 30th October 2001 and was well attended. Congratulations to Jenny Heron for receiving her Life Membership. Jenny has been a tireless worker for BWHA. The list of positions that she has held is an arm long and she continues to be committed to the cause. Again, congratulations Jen you are a most worthy recipient.

In preparation for the 2002 season a planning day was held on 10th November. The newly elected Management Committee attended along with a number of experienced individuals who were able to answer questions and guide us when we got off the track. At this meeting the Management portfolios were given out to the appropriate committee members. A review of fees, fines, forms, the by-laws and local rules was carried out and the draft calendar was drawn up. There was a number of new faces on Management this year including, Desley Mackay (Junior Liaison Officer), Sue Barsby (Vice President) and myself. The day was very productive and informative for all who attended.

I'd like to congratulate Desley Mackay for putting up her hand to fill the vacant position of Junior Chairperson. The running of the junior competition was spread across only a few tireless workers due to a number of vacant positions. This extra work put a lot of strain on these dedicated women, who have given freely of their time. I encourage anyone who has an interest in the running of community organizations or would like to make a contribution to hockey to please become involved in this or any of the BWhA committees.

At the beginning of the year a number of proposals for State and Local Government grants were written. Our submissions included such things as junior development and equipment. I am pleased to advise that we were successful in our endeavours and as such we were able to fill the new part-time positions of Regional Development Officer and Development Administration Officer and upgrade the office computers. I would like to formally welcome Margaret Dilger and Krissy Dickman into the fold and congratulate you on your work thus far.

Words can not explain how much better life has been for our office staff, committee members and club administrators since the new computers were installed. As with any installation of new equipment, there were a few teething problems, but it didn't take long to sort them out and there has been no looking back. The old computers were disposed of, 1 sold, 1 dumped and 1 retained by the BWhA Constitution Committee as a backup for this important area of our association.

The BWhA web site was to be launched early in the year but due to unforeseen circumstances, yes those teething problems, it was finally ready near the end of the season. The address is www.bwha.com.au. All the information you will need for the 2003 season will be available including the year calendar, all forms with associated information sheets and due dates, fixtures, umpire's, results and general information. However, if there is information missing or you would like something added please contact us via the web or by calling the office. I would like to thank Kathy Duggan and Robin Roberts for the hours they have put into this project. The site is user friendly, easy to 'surf' and very informative.

The running of an organization such as ours is a mammoth task, it requires a dedicated team of highly skilled personnel and that is just what BWhA has. Kathy Duggan, Carly Vincenzi, Sharyn Simpson, Margaret Dilger and Krissy Dickman are invaluable to our association. On behalf of the Brisbane Women's Hockey community I express our sincere gratitude to each of you for your enthusiasm and commitment to the job. Sadly Carly left us at the beginning of September. Carly has played hockey from a very young age and was a hard worker for BWhA, her hockey knowledge will be sadly missed. Carly we wish you bon voyage and all the very best for your European adventure. At the time of writing this report the position for Administration Officer has been advertised and we are in the process of short-listing the applicants.

Prior to the commencement of the season the stakeholders of the State Hockey Centre (SHC) conducted a review of the running costs. To alleviate some of the overheads it was agreed that Hockey Queensland would provide administrative support, BWhA would mow the fields and BWhA would supply volunteers to help in the canteen and on the gate. This became the responsibility of the clubs with turf teams. Whilst most clubs tried to supply workers, by the end of the season it became a struggle to find volunteers to carry out these duties. Thank you to the club's officials for organising your members and to those individuals who turned up for your roster. The stakeholders of SHC are in the process of reviewing the year and will be making recommendation for the 2003 season in the near future.

The annual working bee was held in March at Downey Park and Rasey Park and was well attended. The start of the hockey season is a very busy time for John Bigg, our groundsman. Without the assistance of our supporters and the club members, both Downey and Rasey would not be ready for the start of fixtures. A big thanks to John for the work you put into both parks. It would be remiss of me not to thank Bev Broadfoot at this time. Bev works tirelessly doing many jobs behind the scenes, one of them is helping John mark the fields. Again, thank you Bev for giving freely of your time, you don't realise how much you are appreciated.

The inaugural Annual General Meeting of the newly named Southern Cross Committee was held on 19th January in Toowoomba. This was in conjunction with the first round of the pre-season League competition. Representatives from all participating centres filled the positions with Jenny Heron elected as Secretary. The Open competition had been organised at the end of 2001 season so the arrangements for the Veterans, Under 18, 15, 13 and 11 carnivals were dealt with at this meeting. You will see in the results that our BWhA teams were very successful at Southern Cross Hockey this year. I would like to make special mention of our Under 11's who won all three divisions. You must agree that our future is looking very good indeed.

The introduction of Division 4 and J2 to turf hockey played a part in the early start of the turf season on 15th March. The decision to include these divisions was made to expose more players to the artificial surface. It also gave those Clubs, that were not already playing on the turf, an opportunity to field teams in these grades. There was no shortage of Clubs requesting inclusion in these grades, which was a good indication that the right decision was made to offer more turf hockey to our members. Grading games were held after which the Grading Committee met then made their recommendations to Management. Well done to this committee for your foresight and knowledge of the game.

As a result of the Think Tanks, that were held in 2001, regarding umpiring an Umpires Committee was formed to initiate a development program for umpires, umpire coaches, mentors and assessors. This program was put together during the off season so that it could be introduced during 2002 and the results have been very successful. Congratulations to Marilyn Chatfield and her committee members for putting this excellent program together and thank you to the Clubs for your enthusiasm in carrying out its implementation.

Grass fixtures started on 6th April. Thank you to all our grass players for their patience during the upgrade of fields on Downey Park. This year fields 2 and 6 have been out of action because of this upgrade that has been funded by the Brisbane City Council and the State Government. This is to be completed over a three year period and to date fields 8, 11 and 12 have already been done. During the off season fields 1 and 9 will be done with the cabbage patch (fields 4 and 5) to be done during the 2003 season. We would like to thank the Brisbane City Council and the State Government for this initiative and QWASC for their co-ordination.

Our Brisbane teams have been extremely successful this year with victories at Premier League, Under 18, 15 and 13. Congratulations to the Development Committee of Marilyn Chatfield, Sharyn Simpson and Margaret Dilger, the Brisbane Coaches and Managers and of course the players. The conduct of our Brisbane teams has been faultless. They are committed to the cause and respectful of the uniform they play in. To the Brisbane hockey community, you can be very proud of our representative teams. Sharyn Simpson travels with the Hockeyroos on numerous occasions during the year and brings back to our coaches and players the most up to date coaching methods and playing techniques. Her innovative development programs are of the highest standards in the country. The results of our representative teams are testimony to these programs.

Hockey Queensland introduced equalisation of costs to all participants at Premier League (Division One) and the Opens (Division Two) this year. Both competitions are for the men's and women's teams and as such Premier League is held in Brisbane while the Open Leagues are to be held in a different centre each year, this year in Ipswich. Equalisation was bought about by the fact that Premier League is played in Brisbane and the costs to the country centres to travel to Brisbane each year was perceived to be prohibitive. This led to our players having to pay to play and stay in their home centre. BWA subsidised these costs in an effort to assist the players and encourage them to nominate. BWA should see the benefit of equalisation next year when the Open Tournament is held in Townsville. The future will determine how effective this HQ initiative is in allowing all players financial access to play at State Championships.

The calendar was very full this year and as a consequence the President's Cup play offs were abandoned. The teams at the top of the points table at the end of the first round of fixtures were announced the 2002 President's Cup winners. The presentations were made for grass, on the last fixture day along with the Minor Premiers trophies and for turf, on Grand Final day. Congratulations to all of the Presidents Cup winners and well done to the Minor Premiers for being the most consistent team in your division.

The BWA Annual Awards Dinner was held at Kedron Wavell Services Club on 30th August. It was a very entertaining night with comedians, a band and a very amusing MC. All who attended had a great night. Congratulations to all award winners. To Robin Roberts and the organizing committee, thank you.

Grand Final day at Downey Park was a very full day with the junior finals in the morning and seniors in the afternoon. The junior presentations were held on the grass in front of the Club House due to the number of people who were in attendance. The senior presentations were held upstairs in the Club House in front of a very enthusiastic crowd. Congratulations to all the teams who participated on the day. There are many players who have never played in a grand final so no matter what the result, just being a participant on the day is something to be celebrated.

The turf Grand Final day was again held in conjunction with BWA. This format is very successful. It is a great day of hockey for all who attend. The presentations to the Presidents Cup winners, Minor Premiers, Grand Final Runners

Up, Player of the Final and Premiers were held after each final in the courtyard. Congratulations to all recipients with a special mention to our Division One winners: Minor Premiers – Commercial and Premiers – Saint Andrews. Presidents Cup Winner – Easts.

Looking forward to 2003 - I would like to invite everyone who has been part of the Brisbane Hockey community, at any level, to become involved in the associations 70th birthday celebrations. A number of events are being organised including the State Under 13 Championships at the end of June along with displays and activities for all. The assistance of members, clubs and local businesses are most welcome. Please contact the office if you can assist in any way.

My final congratulations and thanks go to all the people who have taken on a position on a BWhA committee and to the club administrators. These people give of their time freely and are devoted to our sport. I thank all those who have helped and supported me in any way over the last 12 months. The experience I have gained will hold me in good standing in the years to come.

I wish everyone a happy and safe festive season and I look forward to seeing you fit and ready for the 2003 season.

GRADINGS

Turf

GRASS UMPIRES STEWARD REPORT

Other clubs need to recognise that BWA require an umpire for every team every week. Where a club has a few umpires they tend to umpire every week. This is stressful for the umpires and so they burn out quickly. When clubs register teams thought must be given to having adequate club umpires.

The other problem is the quality of the umpires in the lower grades. During the season I have endeavoured to give the lower grades some higher ranked umpires to help their game and understanding of the rules of hockey.

I also appeal to all players in the future to support both their club's umpires and the people who umpire their games. If the few are driven away by bad on field behaviour and irrational complaints there will be no hockey at Downey Park.

My thanks to Lyn Thomas who has an enormous knowledge and is so willing to help, without her assistance the season would have been chaotic. Gaye Henderson made a difference by assessing umpires and giving feedback. She also had much help from Lyn and Cheryl.

DEVELOPMENT PORTFOLIO REPORT

Portfolio Report

This department oversees the development of players, umpires, coaches, and officials. After recommendations in 2001 to increase our staff, this season it finally happened. A State Government application was successful and a grant of \$ 5314.50 went towards the part time positions of a Regional Development Officer and a part time Administration Assistant. The development team now consists of a BWA Management position, Regional Director of Coaching

(Sharyn Simpson), Regional Development Officer (Margaret Dilger), Administration Assistant (Krissy Dickman) and a representative from BWhA Junior Management.

The appointment of a Development Officer in Brisbane Women's Hockey has been a necessity for some years. With the vast number of schools and personnel playing hockey in the Brisbane region, and with only so many hours the RDC can physically work, the instigation of a RDO position is a positive measure on BWhA's behalf to encourage participation of the sport.

In addition to our newly appointed staff, a new BWhA umpires format was introduced after consultations and workshops with our affiliated clubs during the 2001 season. For the first time in BWhA history, umpires in division 1, 2 and 3 were given financial assistance towards travel costs etc, and in 2003 it is planned to increase that assistance to include division 4 as well. The Mentor program proved to be successful and hopefully will help to produce an increase in umpires over the next 5 years.

Our 'Coaches Club' was in limbo this season, however it is encouraging to see some nominations for 2003, and the RDC is keen to get this club functional once again.

I wish to thank all involved in assisting me with these major changes to development this year. You have been a part of BWhA's success and have maintained our reputation of an association with vision that is capable of change.

My congratulations to BWhA, Sharyn and her team on yet another successful season.

Apart from the Development Programs and Selection trials held annually for U/18,U/15,U/13 and U/11 age divisions further extension programs were conducted during the off-season for the following:

1. 15 x U/13 players and 15 x U/15 Players were invited to attend Development Day and Hockey Challenge Vs Maryborough Hockey Association.
2. 15 x U/15 players, (Content: Fitness testing, Nutrition, Speed development, Sports Psychology)
3. 15 x U/18 and U/21 players. Skills sessions' Feb-March .2002
4. U/13 and U/15 Development Squad player's parents meeting with RDC were conducted if requested.
5. 2 x BWAH Indoor Hockey Teams participate in fixtures. Division One and Division Two.

During the year BWAH players have enjoyed the involvement in our programs of many Australian and Queensland Representative players and Coaches. Many thanks to all of them for their continued support and assistance.

COACH DEVELOPMENT

We were able to attract a reasonable number of coaches nominating for BWAH representative teams. However, we would like to increase the number of nominations received every year. Especially considering the numbers of very capable club coaches and support staff doing excellent work within their clubs. Part of the role of RDC is to identify Coaches for prospective representative duties and we would like to request all clubs if possible to assist in identifying such coaches and contacting BWAH.

The Coaches Committee (formerly Coaches Association) has been revived for 2002-3. We have received a full compliment of nominations for the Coaches Committee and a meeting has already been planned prior to the BWAH Annual General Meeting. It is envisaged that a plan for the next 2 years will be written and commenced in 2003. Items to be discussed will include coach mentoring, coaching scholarships, coaching awards, player development issues, education opportunities and resources. I look forward to participating in the re-establishment of this working committee with enthusiasm and optimism.

Additional coaching activities held this year were the following:

- Level O Course and Minkey and Modified Guides Day
- Many BWAH Club Coaches received recognition from the Qld. Government "Thanks Coach, Thanks Ref" initiative.
- "Coaches Locker Room" talks x 5
- Coach mentoring, individual meetings and match observations.

GROUNDS REPORT

Working bee

Thanks to all the clubs who sent people to the Working Bee or alternative contributions and thanks to the people who did the hard work! The Working Bee is necessary every year to get the fields, clubhouses and facilities into shape for the hockey season. This year every junior and senior club either sent workers to the working bee or arranged for alternative contributions so it was not necessary to issue any fines. The weather was sunny and hot. All the workers were encouraged to use the right equipment and observe operational health & safety precautions. A great job was done on the fields, clubhouses and facilities and we were able to provide all our hard workers with cake and cordial at the end of the morning.

Fields upgrade

The fields at Downey Park are difficult to maintain because of the landfill under the park, the use of the fields by softball in summer and the public access to the park. However BWhA constantly maintain the fields, seek to upgrade them whenever possible and look for methods to facilitate field maintenance (for example, this year a rule was introduced that teams are not to warm up in the goal circles).

Fields 11 & 12 were upgraded early this year. Fields 2 & 6 were upgraded during the season. Fields 1 & 9 are currently being upgraded and fields 4 & 5 (the Cabbage Patch) will be upgraded next season and if possible field 10. Will be upgraded after that. Field 8 was upgraded last year. This means that over 3 years, all BWhA's fields except 3 (because there is no field 3!), 7, 13 and Rasey Park will have been upgraded on a large scale. John Bigg naturally attends to all our fields throughout the year at both Rasey Park and Downey Park to keep them in the best condition possible in the circumstances.

A new brick area was laid in front of the clubhouse. A new cement slab was laid in front of the hockey shop. The Brisbane City Council completed the second carpark upgrade in May. The equipment sheds have been repaired and repainted. Some of the grandstand seating in the park was dismantled in accordance with Dept of WH&S requirements and is being replaced. The parents' room, hockey shop and first aid rooms are currently being repaired and repainted.

Grounds complaint forms

This form was designed to alleviate the problem of people identifying risks on the fields but not alerting anyone. This year the Grounds Committee received 2 complaint forms, which were actioned straightaway. Remember if you see a problem or want to comment use the form (which is available either from your club secretary or the BWhA office and should be on the website next year).

Hire of fields

We allowed schools to use the fields at Downey Park during the week for a minimum daily grounds allowance and the schools were required to carry their own insurance and indemnify BWhA. The schools included All Hallows, Patrick's Road State School, St Patrick's Primary, Mt St Michaels College, Our Lady of the Assumption and Brisbane Primary Schools District Hockey. We hired out Rasey Park to the Gap Cricket Club to be their home oval over the 2001-2002 and 2002-2003 summers and we hired out Rasey Park to QUT on Wednesday nights for training.

DEVELOPMENT

U13 & U15 SELECTION & DEVELOPMENT

Under 13 and Under 15 Brisbane Women's Junior Selection process began with a development program, followed by trial games. At this development point, no past representative players were present. Under 13's presented with well over 100 players. Under 15's were down on previous years with only approx 80 players.

Obviously the cost of travel played a part in the lack of nominations for Mackay. The fact that the Under 15 championships are in Cairns will impact on next year's nominations also.

The selection format commenced, for under 13's for 2002, seeing coaching staff put the girls through a variety of basic skills. From this, the selectors identified weakness and strength's. The overall level of basic skills was disappointing from the selectors point of view, making our job just so much harder.

Due to the large numbers, many players were eliminated from this early process. It was unfortunate, in the fact that the grass season had not yet commenced, it did not allow us to have a look at them in their own club games. Clubs were asked to allocate a club number for each representative player so that when the season commenced, the selectors could view them in their club games. Unfortunately this request was slow or non-existent.

Assessment and Elimination continued to be part of the selection process during the coming weeks, and with consultation with Sharyn Simpson along the way, were able to finalise the teams for Southern Cross and then State Championships.

The depth of the basic skills was alarming and clubs should be urged to identify this weakness. A Physiotherapist performed fitness tests on injured players before the State Championships and all were able to attend their tournament.

U11 SELECTION & DEVELOPMENT

The Brisbane teams were selected this year after the development program and selection trials to compete in the Southern Cross tournament at Downey Park. Coaches were sourced from clubs and we were fortunate to have the expertise and knowledge of some of the best coaches in Brisbane. This concept I believe is working well with this age group and will continue in years to come.

Originally 4 teams were selected but with the late withdrawal of Gympie, we were fortunate enough to select another team to compete on the day. With over 120 girls nominating for teams, convenor of selectors, Leonie Cross, must be congratulated on her organisation of the teams for selection trials. Her efforts were appreciated by all concerned and went a long way to the smooth running of the trials. I hope Leonie will continue to nominate for selecting positions in future years.

All girls are to be congratulated on their performance on the day. Hopefully they all enjoyed the experience, made a lot of new friends and learnt something from their coaches.
