Numerically things were unchanged, but actually we had lost two Clubs, members of whom merged with others more firmly established. Taxation and Valley Clubs shared the top grade premiership, Commercial took "A Reserve" honours, while Valley II ran out winners in "B" Grade. Teachers College has proved a Club seeking expansion, and it is hoped that the members who graduate from its ranks are able to further knowledge of the game in their chosen career. This Club shared "D" Grade honours with Easts.

It is a job which requires persistence, sometimes to the point of irritation, but most Clubs are willing to keep their records up to date and require little reminding once an error is shown to them.

We again impress on Clubs the necessity for their interest in this matter if the result is to be entirely satisfactory. Conferences will be held regularly throughout the season now approaching, and any suggestions for inclusion or omission in the new Constitution will be gladly received and considered.

SOCIAL REPORT 1956 SEASON

The luncheon provided by Brisbane to all visitors at the Cricket ground was a highlight, and the Queensland Association expressed a debt of gratitude to Brisbane for undertaking this function.

I might mention at this stage that officials of both Brisbane and Queensland worked very harmoniously relative to the social side of the visit of the internationals and that is the only side I was personally with. Our visitors remarked on several occasions on this very same thing and thought it an excellent idea, so different to other states where they only met state officials.

The most successful function of the year was the Breaking-up Social. I venture to say it was the best attended and most enjoyed of any for some time.

UMPIRES REPORT

Ladies,

We have had numerous rules and regulations in the past but Club hockey is so precarious at the present time that to impose penalties would I feel drive more from the game.

The Board realises that some Clubs are handicapped as they have few seasoned players left, but we do appeal to Club Officials to please encourage all players to thoroughly learn their rules and to take their turn at umpiring. Unless we received full support the position will be desperate this season.

Our thanks go to those ex-players who come out regularly often taking two matches in the afternoon, namely, R. Robinson, Nancy and Linda Mauchlan, Isabel Sim, Myra King, Pheme MacDougall, and a special word for those players who week after week through sheer necessity are listed and who never let us down; Thank you, Audrey
