I have much pleasure in submitting to you the twenty-seventh Annual Report of the Brisbane Women's Hockey Association - covering the 1960-1961 Season

The past Season has been a very busy one, however, in my opinion, a very profitable one. We have seen new shelter sheds erected, a mammoth project to raise funds, a very busy inter-city games programme, a great deal of new equipment has been purchased for the Association, two new Clubs joined our ranks, and many other interesting and enjoyable events occurred. On the whole the Association has gained a great deal during the past season, I don't altogether mean materially, but our name has grown more prominence and importance through joining with other Associations in efforts to improve our lot and I do hope that this continues and increases in the future.

OPENING DAY: Our 1960 Season was officially opened on April the 2nd. Our Opening Day Ceremony was held in conjunction with the Basket Ball Association. This Year the March Past of both Associations was held on the Basket Ball side of the Downey Park and we were lucky enough to have Television Station, Channel 7 televise the March Past to be shown on their evening Sports Programme. As is the custom, the best dressed Club is selected from the March Past and this year we had a tie. Valley Women's Hockey Club and Teachers Hockey Club were presented with a Hockey Ball each, by the retiring President, Mrs. C. Grealy, as a memento of the occasion. After the official ceremony an impromptu sports programme was held.

SUB-COMMITTEES:

This has only eventuated from the perseverance of the Grounds Committee. Fixtures: The Fixtures Committee had a tough programme to arrange for us, taking into consideration Easter and the long weekends - it didn't leave us with much time in which to play our Season. Many thanks to the Committee for arranging a compact and very satisfactory programme.

Selection/Grading: This Year, as in previous years our Selection/Grading Committee faced a hard job, watching team after team each Saturday of the Grading Round - ascertaining their standard and allocating them to such, can be a very nerve racking job. I feel sure you will all agree with me that our grading committee deserves a special vote of thanks for their efforts. Unfortunately, due to many of our lower grade selectors being playing members and umpires, and therefore not having sufficient time to attend to their duties, in so far as selecting teams is concerned - the majority of selecting was left entirely to the 'A' Grade Selectors - this is a situation that I feel we must find some solution for during the coming Season.

Team Selections:

As our Records Secretary has included a comprehensive list of all teams selected for the Inter-city Games, in fact all teams selected throughout the year, together with their results, to save duplication, would you please refer to her report for this information.

STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS:

This Year we sent a representative team to Townsville for the State Championships. Mrs. R. Robinson was Manageress with Miss Janet Teys

State Conference: I am very pleased to record that every Brisbane girl who attended the Carnival also attended the Conference. Your Secretary presented a report of the B.W.H.A. activities since the last Conference to the Meeting. At the conclusion of the Meeting the Townsville Association presented a very enjoyable supper and at this point I must congratulate the Townsville Association on their very fine work in connection with the Carnival. Games were run to a very good schedule - Brisbane girls received their fair share of umpiring and the Townsville Association's hospitality was beyond reproach. Congratulations are extended to the Mt. Isa Association who topped the Carnival - a magnificent effort and Brisbane were proud to be runners up in the Carnival.

INTERCITY GAMES: Once again we played Warwick, Toowoomba and Ipswich in the Inter-city Games Competition held each year. These games are enjoyed immensely by the players and it is to be hoped that they will be continued. However, a definite grading of teams and complete organisation of the series must come into being before they become completely successful from the Association's viewpoint.

SCHOOLGIRL'S STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS:

This Year two Schoolgirls' Teams, managed by Mrs. E. McDougall and Mrs. J. Forrest travelled by train to Atherton for the State Championships. From reports received this Carnival was highly successful and thanks go to the Atherton Association for their hospitality to our players and officials. Miss W. McMullin also travelled to Atherton with our Teams and we extend our sincere thanks for the splendid work she did at the Carnival. Thanks also go to Mrs. McDougall and Mrs. Forrest for handling the girls and representing B.W.H.A. so ably.

SCHOOLGIRL'S INTERSTATE CARNIVAL:

The second Schoolgirls' State Carnival was held in Brisbane this year - the first of this kind was held in Sydney last year. Two fields were used at Downey Park from the 29th August to the 2nd September and interstate travellers were privately billeted. A note of the Brisbane girls picked in the Queensland 1 and 2 Teams appears in the Records Secretary's Report. Ladies in our Association who play a large role in controlling, fostering and organising Schoolgirl Hockey are Mesdames E. McDougall, J. Langan, J. V. Black, Misses H. Scraggs, G. Weir and our thanks are extended to you for helping Hockey in the junior ranks.

Many thanks go to those officials who organised the Interstate Carnival and to those who gave their time and energy to help out with the Umpiring.

STATE TEAM:

Congratulations are extended to our girls who obtained selection in the Queensland Team to play in Sydney for the Interstate Carnival. From their experiences I do hope that they encourage the up and coming younger players to improve themselves and endeavour to become State Players.

COACHING AND TRAINING:

Once again during 1960 Season compulsory Training for all girls who wished to nominate for Brisbane Representative Teams was held each Thursday Night at Downey Park. Mrs. R. Robinson and Mrs. L. Renalson as coaches, are to be thanked sincerely for their efforts which are improving the standard of Brisbane Hockey.

WOMEN'S AMATEUR SPORTS COUNCIL:

As an affiliated members of this council, B.W.H.A., have had various commitments to fulfil. On the 26th March, 1960 the Rotary Club of Brisbane organised the 'HY' Carnival - proceeds of which went to the Queensland Bush Children's Health Scheme and the Sports Council. The amount allocated to the Sports Council was to be used for the development of Downey Park as a Women's Sports Reserve which would in turn benefit B.W.H.A. A top-line athletic programme was organised for the Carnival, Stalls were run and eats provided. The Sports Council was in charge of the eats and I am pleased to record that B.W.H.A. did their share of the work exceptionally well. Sincere thanks to Mrs. Josiffe, Miss N. Mauchlan, Miss L. Mauchlan, Mrs. E. McDougall, Mrs. A. Brown and Mrs. Mauchlan who spent the entire day organising and generally helping.

Collection Day:

Previous to the Carnival a Collection Day was organised by Rotary to help raise funds for the staging of the HY Carnival. A Film Evening was held to also raise funds by the Sports Council. In both concerns the B.W.H.A. Players did not support as well as was hoped. Many thanks however, to those girls who did.

PRESENTATIONS: To the girls selected in the Brisbane Team to play in Townsville and also to the Brisbane girls selected to represent Queensland in the Interstate Carnival in Sydney presentations were made by B.W.H.A. which, in some small way, would help defray their expenses.

Congratulations, however, are extended to Sylvia Powell on her magnificent effort in organising the Afternoon Tea for the Ipswich Team visiting us in August and also in organising the Supper for the Breaking Up Party. I do hope that Sylvia continues during the 1961 Season as she will prove an asset to B.W.H.A. Thanks to June Osborne for helping us out in this job at the beginning of the Season.

PUBLICITY: Mrs. Robinson of the "Courier Mail" and "Sunday Mail" and Miss N. Coles of "Truth and Sportsman" once again gave Hockey all the publicity possible and we thank them for their efforts on our behalf. Mrs. Robinson is also the capable writer of the Women's Page in the "Hockey Circle" and her articles gives us all the latest news in the Australian and sometimes Overseas Hockey World.
