Attendance was quite good although the lack of actual 'playing members' was regretted.

Whenever rainy weather was experienced we had a man on the job to report the condition of the fields, and Mrs. Josiffe advises that many a time the Grounds Committee tramped down to Downey Park for an inspection and general discussion on the condition and ways of improving the fields.

Mr. Oskman was visited by members of the committee and his endeavours to help and his guidance is greatly appreciated.

Fixtures - Our Fixtures Committee is once again congratulated and thanked for their fine work in organizing a very difficult side of the hockey at Downey Park. Their work was very greatly appreciated but too often handicapped when Clubs forfeited or just did not turn up, and we only hope that the coming season is handled as expertly in this respect as was 1961.

Selection/Grading - This year, instead of a panel for each grade, one Selection Panel was elected to handle each grade's classifications and also the selecting of each team required to represent Brisbane. When taking into consideration the number of teams in each grade to be classified, the number of teams to be picked to represent Brisbane throughout the year and the fact that the panel consisted of only three members with one proxy, it must be agreed that theirs was a mammoth task and was very happily handled. They are thanked for the complete list of teams selected on each occasion which were immediately submitted to the B.W.H.A. Executive for approval and also for their complete impartiality.

STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS: The 1961 State Championships were held in Maryborough to which two teams were sent. Brisbane 1 was once again unlucky in their matches, being well up until the two final matches. Over the past three years the increase in players sitting for the examination has risen each year by approximately 20 to 25% - these figures reflect favourably on work being done by Clubs, as without their support, no player would make the effort unless the subject was put constantly before them.
