In conclusion - I would like to express thanks to all who have helped the Association and sincerely hope they will continue to help for many seasons to come.

Our 1963 Season was, I feel, one of the most successful on record.

OPENING DAY:

Our Opening Day - April 6th, 1963 - once again was very busy. Our March Past of Club Teams was a spectacular sight and commended by our Patroness Lady T.R. Groom who officially opened the season.

Later afternoon teas were served to Official Guests.

Grading matches were commenced at once and we all had our first taste of hockey for the Season on that day.

MEMBERSHIP:

At the Annual/General Meeting our President welcomed the formation of a new Club - Bulimba Ladies' Hockey Club. This new Club swelled our team strength to 43.

FIXTURES: This Season with Semi-finals and Finals our Fixture Committee had an added task to previous years. Our Season, however, progressed smoothly and well - so the Ladies concerned can put a feather in their caps for a job well done. Thank you Ladies.

SELECTION: Our Selection Panel teamed together for a mammoth task and came through with flying colours. Our thanks to you Ladies for your work in classifying teams and selecting representatives for the various teams.

A quick look at the Team Trips made during the year will give you a rough idea of the amount of work entailed in this job and the results will show the competence of the Members.

SOCIAL GAMES:

I would say that during 1963 the players received the most benefits and obtained the most enjoyment through Country Trips than in any other season.

Approximately 140 girls were chosen at different times to represent Brisbane - I would say a record. These girls had no expenses whatsoever on trips to country centres and must surely appreciate this wonderful experience and opportunity to better their game, make more friends - from other Clubs and other centres - and gain experience for greater chances in seasons to come.

Our trips away were to Toowoomba in May, to Warwick in July and to Murwillumbah also in July.

Visits to our centre were - May Weekend Bundaberg, Tweed and Ipswich and 2nd June (as a preliminary to the State Championships) Tweed, Toowoomba and Ipswich. On these occasions our girls were merely requested to bring along a tart or cake towards our guests' luncheon and afternoon tea.

STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS:

This year with our finance plan working well we were able to send two teams to Cairns for the State Championships. With the Assistance of B.W.H.A. the two teams flew to Cairns with various officials of B.W.H.A. and Q.W.H.A.

Brisbane I team was victorious at the Carnival and 'brought home the bacon'.

Congratulations to those girls who represented Brisbane in Cairns (for list see Record Secretary's Report), and many thanks to the officials of the Queensland Women's Hockey Association, and the Host Centre - Cairns for a marvellous Carnival. Many thanks also to our Team Manageress - for her work over this weekend.

From all reports it was a marvellous trip and we welcome them home.

SCHOOLGIRLS HOCKEY:

Mid-week hockey was played at Downey Park by various schools and many members of our Association are instrumental in the organization of this Hockey.

During 1963 the Secondary Schoolgirls Hockey Carnival was held in Mt. Isa and the Teams composed of many players from Brisbane Clubs. The girls all travelled to Mt. Isa by bus and B.W.H.A. donated a small gift towards the girls' meals on the journey.

COACHING AND TRAINING:

As has been the case for the past few seasons, Mrs. R. Robinson has conducted training of a Thursday evening.

Mrs Robinson spends her time and a great deal of effort and few Clubs take this opportunity to better their standard as well as their girls' physical condition.

With the 1964 Season close at hand we do hope that you will ALL make use of this chance.

A. UMPIRES' CONVENORS' REPORT

Ladies,

I have much pleasure in presenting the report on behalf of the Umpires' Committee.

The past season was again an arduous one inasmuch as it seems well nigh impossible to find out just who is interested in the practical side of umpiring. Quite often committee members test umpires only to receive the 'cold shoulder' when advice is proffered.

May I make a plea now for Clubs to enquire early amongst members and to submit in writing a list of those interested in going further with their umpiring. In that way, the Committee could undertake lectures, tests, etc. at the necessary levels. As it is now each year we speak of lectures which do not eventuate simply because of the lack of information from Clubs.

As is usual there were problems with umpires each Saturday. Most Clubs shouldered their responsibilities well. However, two Clubs in particular did not pull their weight and thus threw more on to those two willing senior clubs - Valleys and Taxation whose members usually oblige last minute requests.

It would be opportune here to thank Taxation, Valley, Rebels and St. Andrews for their splendid assistance with the Semi-finals and Finals.

Might I suggest that if there are only two sets of matches this season that games commence at 1.30 and 3.15 giving a half hour break. This would give player/umpires a chance to take afternoon tea and also allow Clubs to have quick afternoon meetings if necessary. A half hour may sound long but by the time players walk across from Noble Street or from fields 10 and 11, obtain refreshments and perhaps go back to a distant field - 30 minutes is not too long. This break would permit them also to be back on the field for the warning bell and have teams ready for play for the starting signal.

The all Australia Theory Examination held in June attracted 100 candidates, a relatively poor effort when one considers 45 of these were from one Club.
