It is with a great deal of pleasure that I submit to you the thirty-fifth Annual Report of the activities of the Brisbane Women's Hockey Association. Our 1968 season I feel, was a very successful one, due to the unending support and work of the office bearers and members.

OPENING DAY (27th April, 1968)

The 1968 season was officially opened in perfect weather by the Lady Mayoress, Mrs C. Jones. As always the girls in their club uniforms presented a very colourful sight, accompanied by the Police Band in the March past. A presentation was made to Mrs Jones and afternoon tea was served. Many thanks must go to our Judges Mrs H.S. Josiffe, Mrs O. Perry and Mrs J. Paulson who kindly judged Miss D. Acreman as "Miss Hockey," Miss D. Nethercote as "Miss Junior Hockey" and Miss A. Clarke as "Vintage Queen".

MEMBERSHIP

A full list of teams and their gradings and points is presented in the Record Secretary's Report. Sixty teams competed in fixtures, an increase of six on last season. Bulimba Women's Hockey Club joined the ranks of the Senior Association and a special school section was formed which contained fourteen teams in two grades.

UMPIRES' CONVENOR REPORT

Ladies,

This is my report for the 1968 season. It was perhaps the worst for many years in respect of clubs fulfilling their umpiring obligations. On many occasions it was necessary to scout around looking for replacements, we even had to resort to calling for volunteers over the P.A. system.

I think it is quite selfish for some girls to be made bunnies of every week by their malingering team mates. It is urgent that all "A" grade teams make a definite drive in encouraging their players to concentrate on this vital part of their game. From 66 "A" grade players, we had only 13, if that, who were capable of umpiring "A" grade or "A1" matches, yet all these players expect good umpires on their games. It might interest you all to know that during the season, Valleys supplied 123 umpires; Tax. 121; and Saints 98; you can see where the bulk of umpires are coming from. Is it fair to these Clubs?

I was extremely disappointed with the publicity given to metropolitan fixtures in the week-end papers, mainly the Sunday Mail, despite repeated requests by myself for more space, and to have the copy presented in an intelligible manner, it was cut to ribbons and rarely made sense - nothing was achieved.

I must stress that the clubs should all send a letter, together with one from the Brisbane Secretary, to the Editor of the Sunday-Mail asking for more space for their sport, this is the only way to get it. Week-end Tournaments, Intercity games and State Championships all received good coverage. Mid-week hockey also received more than it's fair share of space. Radio and T.V., as usual, were good.

I cannot stress too greatly the need for your Executive to go into the situation of the Grounds and their up-keep..... The drought will, unless it breaks within the next month take considerable toll of the field surfaces. At present - February 1st - they are as hard as rock and only sandshoes could be worn I am concerned as club practices commence shortly and this will mean the circle areas already bare, will be in a deplorable state.

The work done on Field nine has been excellent and the grass would have completely covered same but for the drought. Now I feel field six should be done. This may seem as though fields are eating our finances, but if we want good hockey then we must have good fields. Softball do not use field six so it will be our problem.

I would ask the Association to press their delegates into asking for the "go ahead" sign on the new area adjoining Noble Street as I know that this is to be developed for women's sport. Now is the time to have it done as we could use more fields and we must get in early. The position regarding new nets must also be reviewed now. Might I suggest the association set up a building committee relative to putting a project to the B.C.C., regarding a new club house cum canteen cum store-house. It would be advisable to move quickly as others have similar ideas.

It would also be a good idea to ask the Sports Council for more concrete movable seats now as the summer sun is still with us and seats under the trees are necessary.
