As we were husbanding our resources for the Interstate Tournament for which Brisbane was the venue no social trips were arranged this year, and the only trips were -

State Championships - Cairns - 9th/11th June - Two teams participated with Miss L. Mauchlan, Manager; and Mrs. F. Wastell, Delegate. The selected umpires were Mrs. D. Roberts, Mrs. M. Hughes and Mrs. D. Parkyn. Accommodation was arranged at the Y.A.L. Centre and the group travelled to Cairns by Ansett Airlines.

State Primary Schoolgirl Championships - Gold Coast - 13th/17th August - One team participated capably managed by Mrs. D. Quine. Accommodation for the team, Manager and Camp Mothers was arranged in caravans at the Queen Bee Caravan Park, Palm Beach and Mrs. Quine arranged for their transport in private cars.

State Secondary Schoolgirl Championships - Brisbane - 20th/23rd August - These Championships were originally to be held at Mount Isa and after a frustrating effort endeavouring to arrange accommodation and transport for the anticipated teams the venue was changed to Brisbane and an all-out effort had to be made to ensure that the Championships would be a success. 1973 COACHING REPORT

Ladies,

I'm afraid I cannot get enthusiastic about Thursday night training - it is the same old story over and over again - the good players who want to make Brisbane and State teams turn out and do their circuit training in a most conscientious manner - a sprinkling of others. I readily admit that most clubs now have their own training night and transport is too expensive to make it more than one night a week.

However, I do not have to point out how many unfit players there are in all clubs - no exceptions.

It is so much better to have a large number at physical training whether it be just that, or circuit training - it breeds for better club feeling anyhow. I have asked time and time again for circuit training cards to be prepared and given to National Fitness for running off in hundreds - every girl needs one and I have dozens of requests from country girls for one - will the Association now accept the responsibility of having one card provided for me so that I can, or the Association can ask N.F.C. to supply same in large quantities as part and parcel of a coaching-training programme.

If the players want a different type of fitness programme, or if there is no one available to take a crowd then we can ask N.F.C. to supply a person to do this but only if there is a guarantee that girls will be there.

Our standard of play on the whole leaves room for improvement and the first step towards that goal is "fitness"; whilst lighting is useless for playing games or any form of tactics-training, there is plenty of light for stickwork, and this combined with fitness and speed make the player - we have any amount of players with excellent stickwork who would be only too pleased to take groups on a Thursday night - why not try for a big combined effort this season with players from all clubs chipping in to give help to beginners and players who need help with stickwork. Overseas the players have to perfect their stickwork, fitness and speed before and I say it again BEFORE a coach will be bothered trying to teach them tactics. You just cannot follow the plan if you are not equipped with the basic essentials - these are all available to you and you, if the response is good, then we can set about getting group leaders right away as well as circuit cards for the individual. Who is going to produce the most improved circuit card in 1974? If you or your club is interested in Thursday night training, please advise Association Secretary by next meeting.
