LADIES,

PERUSAL OF THIS FORTY-THIRD ANNUAL REPORT OF B.W.H.A.'S ACTIVITIES SHOULD REVEAL SOME INTERESTING CHANGES AND DEVELOPMENTS FOR FUTURE PLAYERS.

IN MARKED CONTRAST TO LAST YEAR, THIS REPORT FOLLOWS A SEASON OF PERFECT PLAYING CONDITIONS, COMMENCING ON APRIL 5TH AND CLOSING ON AUGUST 30TH.

OPENING DAY TOOK THE FORM OF SOCIAL GAMES TO ORIENTATE PLAYERS AND UMPIRES TO THE NEW RULES. MISS MAUCLAN WELCOMED ALL TO A PICTURESQUE DOWNEY PARK AND INTRODUCED MRS. ROBINSON WHO OFFICIALLY OPENED THE SEASON.

CLUB OFFICIALS WHO USUALLY HAVE A VERY BUSY FIRST SATURDAY BORE THE EXTRA BURDEN OF HAVING TO SUBMIT NOMINATIONS AND MONEY FOR SOUTH BURNETT, STATE CHAMPIONSHIP AND QUEENSLAND TEAMS. THIS PROMPTED THE PRESIDENT TO SUGGEST THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING BE HELD IN OCTOBER TO GIVE ALL INCOMING OFFICE BEARERS AND COMMITTEES TIME TO ADJUST, AND ALSO ENABLE THEM TO SET OUT THE ENTIRE SEASON'S PROGRAMME WELL IN ADVANCE.

MEMBERSHIP

DARWIN AND GRIFFITH UNIVERSITY CLUBS WERE WELCOME NEWCOMERS IN OUR MIDST, AND THIS INCREASED TEAM NUMBERS TO ONE HUNDRED AND FIVE.

MEETINGS

THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING HELD IN THE SWIMMING ASSOCIATION ROOMS, FORTITUDE VALLEY ON MARCH 4TH WAS WELL ATTENDED. TABLE COMMITTEE WERE RETURNED UNCHALLENGED, AS WERE MANY OTHER POSITIONS WITH VOTING REQUIRED ONLY ON COMMITTEES.

ELEVEN EXECUTIVE, ELEVEN GENERAL AND FOUR JUNIOR MEETINGS CONSTITUTED THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE 1975 YEAR.

SOUTH BURNETT COMPETITION

MISS SHIRLEY OTTO REPRESENTED BRISBANE AT A CONFERENCE IN MARYBOROUGH ON MARCH 15TH. HERE IT WAS DECIDED THAT THIS ANNUAL EVENT WOULD BE HELD OVER THE MAY WEEKEND WITH ALTERNATING VENUES COMMENCING IN BUNDABERG, AND WOULD BE DIVIDED INTO SENIOR, UNDER EIGHTEEN AND UNDER SIXTEEN TEAMS.

BRISBANE TEAMS TRAVELLED BY BUS TO BUNDABERG AND MANAGERS MRS. KING AND MISS BYRNE DECLARED BOTH BUS AND DRIVER WERE WELL BELOW STANDARD.

HOWEVER, CAPTAINS REPORTED IT A MOST ENJOYABLE CARNIVAL WITH BRISBANE SENIORS BEING SUCCESSFUL.

STATE CHAMPIONSHIP - JUNE 14TH-16TH

MURWILLUMBAH HOSTED THE STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS IN SOME BITTERLY COLD WINDS BUT THIS DID NOT COOL REPRESENTATIVES ENJOYMENT OF THE WEEKEND. A SUNNYBANK BUS TRANSPORTED THREE TEAMS AND OFFICIALS TO THE MURWILLUMBAH MOTEL WHERE THE ACCOMMODATION WAS EXCELLENT; MISS CARMEL WAUGH ORGANIZED EVENING MEALS AT THE BOWLS CLUB WHERE FOOD AND PRICES WERE MOST ACCEPTABLE; PLAYERS AND BUS DRIVER HAD SOME SUCCESS WITH THE POKER MACHINES; AND BRISBANE No. 1 WON THE CARNIVAL WITH BRISBANE No. 2 SECOND. ALTHOUGH NEWCOMERS IN THIS FIELD, MRS. D. ROBERTS AND MRS. A. SIMMONDS MANAGED THESE TEAMS VERY CAPABLY. DENISE WAS LATER NAMED MANAGER OF THE STATE UNDER EIGHTEEN TEAM.

NINE BRISBANE GIRLS WERE SELECTED TO REPRESENT THE STATE IN ADELAIDE, THREE UNDER EIGHTEENS TO TRAVEL TO SYDNEY AND TWO STATE "A", 1 STATE "B" AND TWO STATE "C" UMPIRES BADGES WERE AWARDED.

FROM OUR ANGLE, A MOST SUCCESSFUL WEEKEND - CONGRATULATIONS TO ALL.

U18 CHAMPIONSHIPS

QUEENSLAND WERE UNDEFEATED IN THIS THEIR FIRST ENTRY INTO THE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS, AND IF AS RUMOURED, IT BECOMES AN UNDER 19 COMPETITION THE SAME TEAM WOULD BE ELIGIBLE FOR THE 1976 MEETING WHICH WILL BE HOSTED BY BRISBANE.

NAMBOUR SCHOOLGIRLS CARNIVAL - JULY 20TH

WITH THE REJECTION OF A THIRD TEAM TO THE SCHOOLGIRLS CHAMPIONSHIPS, THIS TEAM WAS GIVEN THE OPPORTUNITY OF PLAYING IN THE NAMBOUR SCHOOLGIRLS CARNIVAL. MANAGED BY A YOUNG JAN GARDNER, THESE GIRLS FINISHED A VERY CREDITABLE THIRD BEHIND CENTRES USING THIS AS A TRAINING RUN FOR BUNDABERG.

SECONDARY SCHOOLGIRLS CHAMPIONSHIPS - 10TH-13TH AUGUST

ANSETT ARRANGED A VERY EARLY MORNING FLIGHT TO BUNDABERG FOR THE TWO TEAMS ACCEPTED IN THE SCHOOLGIRLS CHAMPIONSHIPS - 5 A.M.. MANAGERS MRS. McDougall and JULIE BRADFIELD PRAISED THE BREAKFAST AND DINNER SUPPLIED BY THE AIRLINE, ACCOMMODATION AND MEALS AT THE SUNRAE MOTEL, AND THE BEHAVIOUR OF THE GIRLS. COMPREHENSIVE CAPTAINS REPORTS INDICATE THAT TEAM EFFORTS BROUGHT ABOUT THE SUCCESS ENJOYED BY THE FIRST TEAM WINNING THE "A" SHIELD AND THE SECOND TEAM TIEING WITH CAIRNS FOR THE "C".

KIM EVANS AND JULENE SUNDERLAND MADE IT TWO IN A ROW WHEN CHOSEN IN THE 'BEST FIFTEEN' ALONG WITH NERYL ANDREWS. HEARTIEST CONGRATULATIONS TO ALL THREE.

B.W.H.A. CARNIVAL - JUNE 1ST

OUR ANNUAL "AT HOME" HELD ON JUNE 1ST WAS WELL ATTENDED AND THOROUGHLY ENJOYED BY ALL, ALTHOUGH SOME LOCAL CLUBS WERE SLIGHTLY INCONVENIENCED BY THE REDRAW.

COACHING AND TRAINING

A SCHOOL FOR GOALIES WAS ESTABLISHED BY MRS. N. GORDON AND MISS S. OTTO ON THURSDAY NIGHTS AND THE FEW GIRLS WHO AVAILED THEMSELVES OF THIS OPPORTUNITY ARE DELIGHTED WITH THE RESULTS.

COMPULSORY TRAINING FOR BRISBANE NOMINEES HAS BECOME FARICAL AS MORE AND MORE PLAYERS SUBMIT LEGITIMATE EXCUSES FOR THEIR ABSENCE. STATE PLAYERS WERE DELEGATED TO TAKE THE TRAINING SESSION AND MUST SURELY BE DISHEARTENED BY THE TURN UP.

SIX COACHES WORKED WITH SELECTED TEAMS AND CAPTAINS INVARIABLY SHOWED APPRECIATION IN THEIR REPORTS, NOW WE WOULD LIKE TO ADD OUR THANKS FOR YOUR VALUABLE TIME AND EFFORTS.

UMPIRING

FIVE MORE BADGED UMPIRES HAVE JOINED OUR RANKS THIS YEAR BUT COMPETENT UMPIRES ARE IN SHORT SUPPLY AS YOUR STEWARD HAS TESTIFIED IN HER REPORT. JUDGING BY THE PROBLEMS MRS. PARKYN EXPERIENCED IN OBTAINING UMPIRES FOR THE FINALS, THE POSITION IS EXTREMELY SERIOUS. INTEREST COULD NOT BE LOWER WHEN SIX ONLY SIT FOR THE BRISBANE SECTION OF THE EXAMINATION. EVERY PLAYER WANTS A GOOD UMPIRE SO WHY NOT BE MOTIVATED INTO BEING A GOOD UMPIRE. PLAYERS SHOULD REMEMBER ALSO THAT MRS. PARKYN IS PERFORMING A VERY NECESSARY IF THANKLESS TASK AND SHOW A LITTLE MORE CO-OPERATION.

MRS. ROBINSON HAS SUGGESTED THE SOUTH BURNETT COMPETITION WOULD BE A GOOD TESTING GROUND FOR BRISBANE UMPIRES INTERESTED IN STATE BADGES, SEEING AS VERY FEW CAN BE TESTED AT THE STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS. IF THESE HIGHER AWARDS APPEAR MORE READILY AVAILABLE IT MAY REVIVE INTEREST.

RECORDS

REGISTRARS IN BOTH THE SENIOR AND JUNIOR SECTIONS WERE VERY THOROUGH AND QUITE A FEW CLUBS LOST POINTS OR MONEY DUE TO THEIR VIGILANCE. DESCRIBED AS A "POLICEMAN'S JOB" IT IS A

NECESSARY ONE AND BOTH GIRLS ARE TO BE COMMENDED ON A JOB WELL DONE.

FINANCE

MRS. McDougall handled our finance with her customary efficiency. No one would ever worry over money being spent unwisely whilst she had the reins, but most would be unaware that she has now completed twenty years as Treasurer to B.W.H.A. which is no mean feat. Thank you, Mrs. McDougall.

CANTEEN

POWER RESTRICTIONS CAUSED CURTAILMENT OF FOOD LINES ON A NUMBER OF OCCASIONS AND YET WITH TRADING ON TWENTY DAYS YOUR CANTEEN MADE A PROFIT OF \$1,843.18. PURCHASE OF NEW EQUIPMENT AND A REMUNERATION FEE TO MRS. GREEN SAW B.W.H.A. REALIZE \$1,310.61. MRS. GREEN AND MISS LINDA MAUCLAN CAN BE JUSTIFIABLY PROUD OF THE RESULTS OF THEIR HARD WORK, AND I'M SURE ALL PLAYERS APPRECIATE FIRSTLY THE FOOD SUPPLIED AND SECONDLY THE LOWER FEES DUE INDIRECTLY TO CANTEEN PROFITS.

SUB COMMITTEES

EXECUTIVE, FIXTURES, SELECTION & GRADING ALL FORM AN ESSENTIAL PART OF THE ADMINISTRATION OF YOUR ASSOCIATION, AND CONTAIN SOME VERY DEDICATED WOMEN. CONSIDER THE PEOPLE WHO PRESENT THEMSELVES AT DOWNEY PARK EVERY SATURDAY FROM 8.00 A.M. TO 6.00 P.M., ALSO THOSE WHO HAVE HOCKEY AND ITS ADVANCEMENT UPPERMOST IN THEIR MINDS FOR SEVEN DAYS A WEEK. THEY HAVE BEEN 'AROUND' FOR MANY YEARS AND ARE INDISPENSABLE.

PERHAPS THE MOST MALIGNED WOULD BE SELECTION AND GRADING, BUT THE OLD ADAGE "YOU CAN'T PLEASE EVERYONE" IS SO TRUE.

GROUNDS

YOUR GROUNDS COMMITTEE HAS ALWAYS RECEIVED TREMENDOUS SUPPORT AND ASSISTANCE FROM MR. DAVE FERRIS AND THIS YEAR AGAIN WAS NO EXCEPTION. MR. FERRIS HAS BEEN GROUNDSMAN FOR TWELVE YEARS AND HAS ALWAYS EXTENDED HIS AID BEYOND THE CALL OF DUTY.

EXTRA PARKING SPACE PROVIDED THIS YEAR RELIEVED THE CONGESTION CONSIDERABLY.

THE \$12,000 LIGHTING SYSTEM INSTALLED ON FIELD THREE IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE SOFTBALL ASSOCIATION IS READY FOR USE NOW AND IT IS HOPED THAT CLUBS WILL TAKE FULL ADVANTAGE OF IT TO JUSTIFY THE EXPENSE.

UNIFORMS

MARCH PAST AT THE STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS REVEALED BRISBANE WAS THE ONLY CENTRE RETAINING THE BOX PLEATED TUNIC WORN BY THE THIRD TEAM. NEW UNIFORMS NOW ON ORDER WILL REMEDY THIS FOR NEXT YEAR.

FEES

TO COUNTER A 20% INCREASE BY Q.W.H.A. AND THE IMPOSITION OF WATER, GENERAL AND SEWERAGE RATES BY THE CITY COUNCIL, FEES WERE SET AT \$70.00 AND \$55.00 PER TEAM RESPECTIVELY FOR SENIORS AND JUNIORS.

PRESENTATIONS

CUSTOMARY FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE WAS PROVIDED FOR MEMBERS OF THE SCHOOLGIRLS TEAM, AND TO MEMBERS AND UMPIRES OF THE STATE CHAMPIONSHIP TEAMS.

STATE AND UNDER 18 REPRESENTATIVES RECEIVED CHEQUES FOR DOUBLE THE REGULAR AMOUNT. THESE GIRLS CAN THANK YOUR SOCIAL SECRETARY, MRS. SIMMONDS, ENTIRELY FOR THEIR WINDFALL. ANN HAS WORKED TIRELESSLY THROUGHOUT THE SEASON TOWARDS FUND RAISING AND HAS SOME PROGRESSIVE IDEAS FOR BIGGER AND BETTER THINGS FOR 1976.

B.W.H.A. UMPIRES' COMMITTEE REPORT

LADIES,

SOME POINTS WERE RAISED AS A RESULT OF GAMES EMPIRED THIS SEASON:

1. WE NEED MORE GRADED UMPIRES IN EACH CLUB. WHILE MOST CLUBS PULL THEIR WEIGHT IN NUMBERS OF EMPIRES, WE FEEL THAT NOT VERY MANY CLUBS ARE CONCENTRATING ON PRODUCING QUALITY OF UMPIRING. IF ENTHUSIASM DOES NOT IMPROVE, OUR ASSOCIATION MAY HAVE TO LIMIT THE NUMBERS OF TEAMS ALLOWED TO PARTICIPATE IN FIXTURES TO THOSE CLUBS WHOSE MEMBERS ARE SERIOUS ABOUT SUCH DUTIES AS SITTING FOR THEORY TESTS AND CONSCIENTIOUSLY UMPIRING WHEN PUT DOWN - NOT SUBSTITUTING AS CLUBS SEE FIT.
2. FAR TOO MUCH DESTRUCTIVE CRITICISM IS BEING AIMED AT THOSE GIRLS WHO ARE DOING THEIR BEST TO KEEP THE GAME GOING. WHILE SEASONED UMPIRES CAN USUALLY MANAGE TO IGNORE THIS UNFAIR HECKLING, MANY YOUNGER GIRLS ARE REALLY BEING WORRIED AND QUITE OFTEN JUST GIVE UP. PLEASE, CLUBS, CONTROL YOUR MEMBERS AND YOUR SUPPORTERS IN THIS REGARD, AND GIVE OUR UP AND COMING UMPIRES HELP, NOT ABUSE.
3. EACH CLUB WILL BE ISSUED WITH A CARD ON WHICH WE WOULD REQUEST THAT THE NAMES OF ALL GIRLS INTERESTED IN UMPIRING BE WRITTEN. WE INTEND TO HAVE A MEETING OF ALL THESE PEOPLE, WITH UMPIRES ALREADY BADGED, AT THE BEGINNING OF NEXT SEASON. WE HOPE THAT WE WILL BE ABLE TO ARRANGE A FIELD DEMONSTRATION AT THAT TIME, SO THAT ALL OUR UMPIRES AND INTENDING UMPIRES WILL BE "ON THE SAME WAVELENGTH".
4. WE INTEND TO BE A LOT HARDER ON ROUGH PLAY NEXT SEASON, WARNING PLAYERS AND, IF NECESSARY, SENDING OFF.

IN CONCLUSION, MANY THANKS TO ALL THOSE GIRLS WHO CONSISTENTLY UMPIRED FOR US, AND TO THOSE WHO FILLED IN AT SHORT NOTICE EVEN THOUGH THEY WERE DUE FOR A WEEK OFF. TO THOSE FEW CLUBS WHO COMPLAIN BITTERLY ABOUT UMPIRES, PLEASE BECOME INVOLVED WITH UMPIRING MORE FULLY, AND MAYBE YOU'LL REALISE THAT ALL OUR UMPIRES DO THE BEST JOB THAT THEY CAN - WITHOUT PREJUDICE.
