

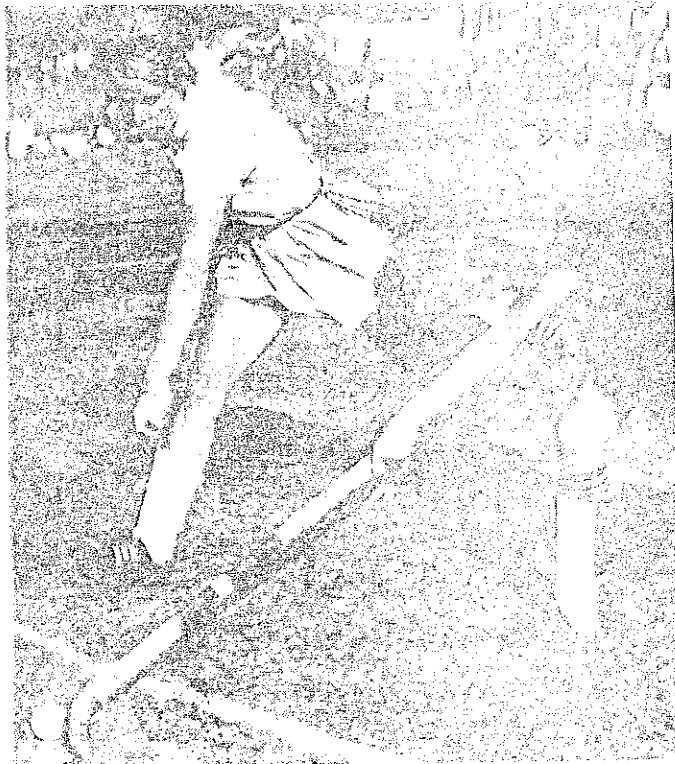

S E C R E T A R Y ' S R E P O R T

Ladies,

The Forty-fifth year of our Association has been I have no doubt, the same as many in the past and many more to come. It has had its share of joy, sorrow, success and failure. Still hockey remains the sport we all love and enjoy, otherwise we would not be joined together to-night to hear this report.

For your interest I will endeavour to set out below the events of the year.

MEETINGS.

Since our Annual Meeting last October we have held 9 general monthly meetings and 10 Executive Meetings, plus those meetings held by the Junior section of our Association. Whilst Executive meetings were very well attended, some clubs did not make the effort to attend all monthly meetings.

MEMBERSHIP.

A total of 73 Senior and Junior teams participated in fixtures each week. In 13 senior grades, 39 teams representing 21 clubs commenced fixtures each Saturday at 12.30p.m. and concluded playing at 4.45p.m. Full details of the Junior Section will be set out in the report from the Junior Secretary, Mrs. Peggy Hall.

WIDE BAY - BURNETT COMPETITION - 1/2 MAY.

The first event after the commencement of the season on 2nd April was the Wide Bay Burnett Competition which was held this year at Downey Park. Four centres attended. They were Maryborough, Bundaberg, Brisbane and Gold Coast who were invited to participate this year. The competition was a great success with Brisbane seniors coming through undefeated; the Under 19 team lost their game against Gold Coast and were not disgraced when defeated by the Brisbane Senior team. The Under 16 team lost one game to Maryborough and their game against Bundaberg Under 19 team.

All centres thoroughly enjoyed the competition.

STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS - ROCKHAMPTON - JUNE

Three Brisbane teams were selected and travelled to Rockhampton by air. Brisbane 1 and 11 were successful in winning their respective pools - Brisbane 11 were disappointed that they were not included in the A pool thus missing out on a 'crack' at the No. 1 team. Brisbane 111 did very well with 3 wins, 1 draw and 1 loss. Congratulations to all those players selected to represent Queensland in the Senior and Under 19 teams. Congratulations to those umpires who gained badges, not only at this championship but throughout the season.

TRIPS TO WARWICK & NAMBOUR - JULY 17

Teams from the lower grades - 2 to Warwick and 1 to Nambour - were selected and according to the reports which were duly handed in, all players acquitted themselves very well. The girls apparently enjoyed the trips and thanks must go to the Managers and umpires who travelled with them.

GYMPIE TRIP. - AUGUST 7th.

The two B.W.H.A. Primary Schoolgirls teams selected to represent at the Championships in Maryborough, travelled to Gympie to participate in a carnival under the watchful eyes of their Manageresses, Mrs. Deniece Quine and Mrs. Jenny Tidey. The No. 1 team won all their games and the No. 2 team had two wins and one loss. This carnival was a wonderful opportunity for the teams to play together before travelling to Maryborough for the Championships.

B.W.H.A. "AT HOME"

The annual B.W.H.A. "At Home" Carnival was held once again this year, and as usual was a great success. We certainly hope to continue this event in the future.

PRIMARY SCHOOLGIRLS CHAMPIONSHIPS - 21-24th AUGUST.

The Primary Schoolgirls Championships this year were held in Maryborough. Two B.W.H.A. teams were selected. Brisbane 1 finished 9th out of 14 teams and Brisbane 11 came 4th out of 8 teams. The carnival was a great success and was very well organised by the Maryborough Association. One comment by the Manageresses was the wish that the teams could be selected earlier in the season to allow the girls more time to practice as a team.

SECONDARY SCHOOLGIRLS CHAMPIONSHIPS - 14-17th AUGUST.

The Secondary Schoolgirls Championships were also held in Maryborough, this centre obviously having a very busy time. In the A pool Brisbane 1 finished 6th out of 8 teams; Pool B - Brisbane 11 finished 8th out of 8 teams and in the C Pool, Brisbane 111 came 4th out of 8 teams. Trouble was experienced with accommodation and a bus which kept breaking down, even so the girls and those who accompanied them enjoyed the championships. Kathy Proctor was named one of the best 15 players of the championships.

BRISBANE UMPIRES' CONVENER'S REPORT 1977

Ladies,

I have much pleasure in presenting the following report for the 1977 season, on behalf of the Umpires' Committee. At first glance it may appear that the Testing Committee has not been as active this year as usual, but closer scrutiny in fact will show that this was not so. The Board has been concerned for some time now, that insufficient time was being spent in the coaching and upgrading of our umpires aspiring to the higher levels of State A, B and C, and consequently, at our meeting of the Umpires' Board held early in the season it was decided to concentrate our efforts in this direction this year. Considerable time and effort was thus spent in coaching and testing at this level each week, and I would like to express my thanks to all members of the Umpiring Committee for their help but especially to Mrs. Langan, Mrs. Robinson and Miss. Nan Mauchlan, without whose constant dedication and testing of umpires for higher badging would be most difficult. I fully realise that there are umpires to whom we have not been able to give sufficient time, but I would hope that you will maintain your interest, and remind you that there are a certain number of games only each week of sufficient standard to test for these higher badges.

Next year it is hoped that the Board may be able to concentrate its efforts for the first half-season on the candidates for higher badgings, and during the second half of the season spend considerable time with beginner umpires. Once again, meetings held for the purpose of discussing rule interpretation were not well attended, and I would recommend that the Umpires' Committee spend some time before the 1978 season in solving this problem. One other recommendation which I would like to put forward for consideration is the possibility of holding our umpiring seminar on a Sunday early in the coming season.

At the Australian Umpires' Examination held this year, 43 Brisbane candidates sat, and the results of such, as well as the practical badges awarded for the season, follow this report. May I extend my congratulations to all successful candidates, but special mention must be made of our Queensland candidate for A.A. testing, Jan Hadfield, who was awarded her A.A. Umpires' Badge in Melbourne during the recent Australian Championships. Well done, Jan - you have worked hard and umpired constantly each week this season. May you enjoy many years of top umpiring.

Before concluding my report, I would like to say a special "thank you" to Marise Stephens, our Umpires' Steward, whose task of the allocation of umpires each week takes much constant time and effort. Thank you, also, to Dell Parkyn for always being willing and available to help in conducting rules discussions and the supervision of examinations during the season.

May I express my sincere appreciation to all umpires for your interest and co-operation throughout the 1977 season, and wish you all good whistling and playing in 1978,

GROUNDS COMMITTEE'S REPORT

Ladies,

This is a brief report on behalf of the Grounds Committee. At the beginning of the 1977 season the grounds were in excellent condition due to winter rains but deterioration was noticeable as the season progressed, due to drought conditions which are still very much in existence.

In fact, I have never seen Downey Park look so poor - there is hardly a blade of grass and dust is a nuisance.

The Association was involved in a controversy over the new toilet block at Granville Street, and this matter is still not completed. Mrs. McDougall deserves a great deal of credit for the many hours she spent with Council staff, not only on this matter, but on all matters pertaining to the maintenance of our area.

The Association would find it difficult to replace both Mr. & Mrs. McDougall who were at the Park every single week of the hockey season looking after nets, holes in the playing areas, scrounging top dressing and filling which saved the Association a lot of time, worry and expense.

The floodlit area was used extensively and I would like to see the clubs using this area be prepared to do some watering of the goal areas when such dry conditions persist all season. It is too much for the groundsman and the McDougalls day after day.

The clubs on the whole co-operated well as far as bringing in line posts and clearing the area of litter, but some completely ignored requests to do their share. Painting of backboards is a necessity and if volunteers are required before next season it will have to be rostered so as all clubs pull their weight. This also refers to canteen cleaning, painting etc., prior to the opening of the season - these matters all pertain to "Grounds."

I cannot understand why hockey players cannot park their cars in such a manner that everyone has a fair go at leaving the area without having to have other cars removed. Softball players have no trouble and there are twice as many cars.

The B.W.S.A. is leaving the area in front of the office free this season, their main diamond is now between the two hockey fields. This means we could do some work on this area. They have also made less use of the floodlit area to give it a chance to recover from twelve months continuous usage.

The Q.W.A.S.C. is seeking information from the B.C.C. on the future of Downey Park as far as the amount of ground available (such as the area at the back of the floodlit field) and the present parking areas which are not part of Downey Park.

The fields were regularly marked during the season, and prior to the season marked out in oil by Mr. & Mrs. McDougall - a marathon task.

We still have a very few reliable gentlemen who come to our assistance with the placing and removal of nets and here again it is almost impossible to say why we cannot get more men from so many clubs to assist the Association with some of the tasks too heavy for our female members. Whilst we all applaud the progress of our clubs, a thought now and again to the B.W.H.A. who makes it all possible for Saturday afternoon fixtures, would be terrific. We too could then have decent playing areas.
