

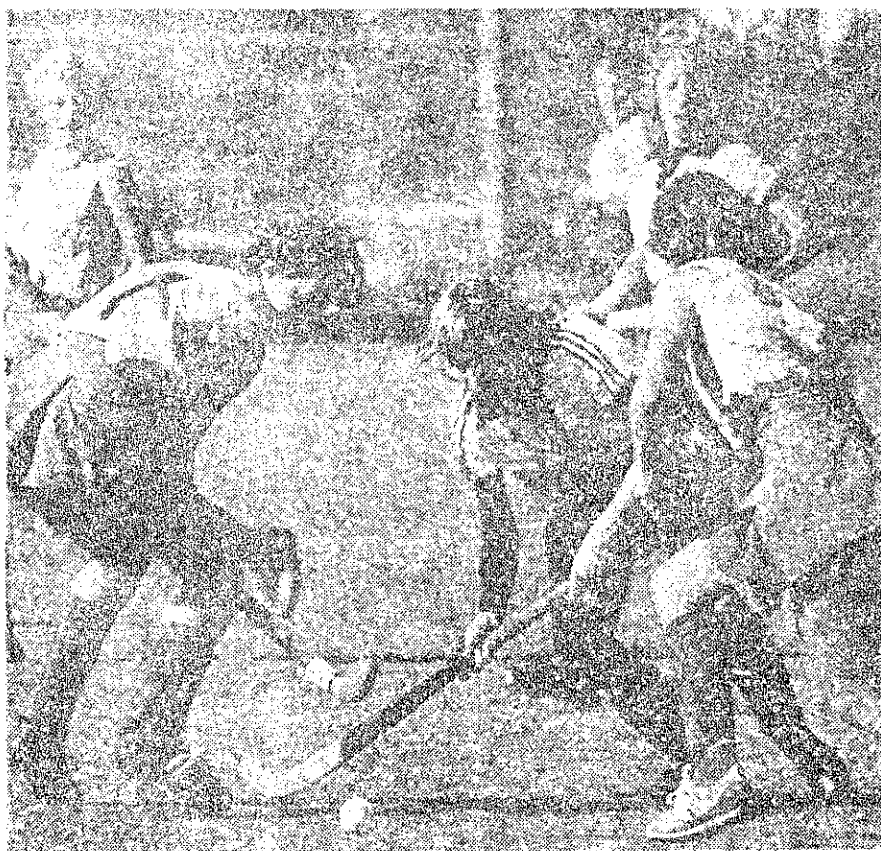

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Ladies,

The forth-sixth year of our Association was, I feel, the most stimulating we have experienced for some time. The stimulus was provided by interesting hockey; closely fought grand finals; reintroduction of eight team grades; success of representative teams and players; the dream of adequate facilities at Downey Park becoming more real and enthusiastic activity in the Junior Section.

Since our last Annual Meeting the incoming Office Bearers for 1978 were treated to a Christmas outing at a theatre-restaurant. A most enjoyable and comical evening was enjoyed by all.

February saw the commencement of training for most clubs and the first executive meeting was held on 7th. A special meeting had been held in October to discuss with clubs, the format of the 1978 season. During the year 12 executive, 6 general, 1 special general and 1 special executive meeting to discuss the proposed building, were held. The Junior section also held regular monthly meetings.

The season commenced on 1st April, as it concluded - very, very wet. A total of 21 fixtures, including 4 Sunday fixtures, plus 2 senis and a grand final were contested by 79 senior teams representing 22 clubs. Congratulations to those teams who were successful in taking out premierships, to the 'not so successful' 1979 is another year. Premiership pennants were presented on Grand Final day by the President, Miss. Nan Mauchlan. Rules for the Grand Finals were altered this year. In the event of a draw an extra ten minutes each way was played, if still a draw the team with the highest premiership points was declared the winner.

I might point out at this stage, that a complete report on the Junior section is included later in this report.

During the season a number of representative teams were selected by both Junior and Senior Selection Committees. All personnel of these teams were assisted financially in some way, as were the Brisbane players selected to represent the State in the senior and under 19 teams.

Wide Bay-Burnett Competition - Bundaberg - May
Brisbane was represented in this competition by 2 senior, an under 19 and an

under 16 team. Brisbane 1 won all four matches; Brisbane 11 had 1 win and 3 losses; Under 19 team won all 3 games and the under 16 team had 3 losses.

Brisbane 1 v Combined New Zealand Universities Team - Downey Park - May

This game resulted in a 2 all draw. Spectators reported a very exciting match with expert skills demonstrated by the New Zealand girls. B.W.H.A. badges were presented to the N.Z. side.

State Championships - Townsville - June

Brisbane fielded two teams in the State Championships. Brisbane 1 were successful in taking out the championship. Brisbane 11 had 2 wins and 3 losses. Congratulations to those players who were selected to represent the state in the senior and under 19 teams. Congratulations also to those members who gained umpiring badges at the championships.

Primary & Secondary Schoolgirls Championships - August

Primary schoolgirls teams were selected to participate in the championships at Gympie and Secondary schoolgirls teams attended their championships in Mackay. Both sections were more successful than they have been for many years.

Congratulations must go to players, selectors, coaches, manageresses and umpires who made the representative team scene so successful.

Senior Interstate Championships - Sydney - August

Congratulations to all those Brisbane players who participated in this championship, and I'm sure, who contributed in no small way to Queensland's great success this year. A special pat on the back to those players who gained selection in the Australian team and Australian squad.

Under 19 Interstate Championships - Canberra - September

1978 once again saw the Under 19 team on the top of the ladder. Congratulations girls, you make the future look very bright.

Coaching in '78

Coaching films were obtained from Q.W.H.A. and were shown by Brisbane and a number of clubs. The films were excellent and were very much appreciated by those who saw them. Thanks Heather for showing the films for Brisbane.

Umpiring

Many thanks to our Umpires Convener Miss. Heather Scraggs and Umpires Steward Mrs. Marise Stephens for their hard work during the season in this field. Regular Board meetings were held and much testing of umpires by AA and State A umpires was carried out. Due in no small way to the interest of these people, much more enthusiasm is being shown in umpiring. An Umpires Association has been formed by Q.W.H.A. and any player may join for a small fee.

Canteen

Once again our canteen was very ably convened by Miss. Linda Mauchlan, assisted by Purchasing Officer Mrs. Elizabeth Green. Not only did the canteen fill the stomachs and quench the thirst of many, it also made a tidy profit which will be seen in the Canteen Statement. A much more responsible attitude is required by clubs in the form of mature 'mums' to direct club members on their rostered days in the canteen.

Social

Mrs. Ann Simmonds once again looked after the social side of things this year. Ann put in a lot of time in raffles, T shirt selling and the big event of the season, a dinner dance. Many thanks Ann for all your assistance.

A competition was run to find a suitable design for flashes and car stickers. A very striking winning entry was forthcoming from Miss. Donna Gifford of Mt. Gravatt Eagles Club. It is our intention to use this design for flashes and stickers next season.

The annual B.W.H.A. "At Home" carnival was staged in May and was very successful. Teams from Ipswich, Gold Coast and Tweed attended, together with 21 club teams and a 'Graduates' team. I think the 'Graduates' may have enjoyed the day most. A cake staff was run by Brisbane on the day and proved most profitable. Thanks to all officials who assisted in the arranging and running of the carnival and thanks also to Miss. Janne Ellis and Mrs. Eileen Grealy who also assisted.

Finance

Mrs. Pheno McDougall our Treasurer for many years once again so ably looked after our finance. Fee rises were introduced on a 'grade basis' this season as clubs had indicated this in preference to fund raising during the season. Many thanks Pheno for your untiring assistance and interest.

Games Records

As an ex-games secretary stated - she had it down to a fine art and it took her 7 hours of writing and checking for one fixture day. Cheryl also had to contend with four double headers during the season. Many thanks Cheryl.

Travel arrangements and accommodation this season was once again looked after by Miss. June Snarski. As June will tell you, it is very hard to tie hotel/motel owners down and what you expect and what you get when you finally get there are two different things. Many thanks June for your work and effort in this area.

Time Steward

Unfortunately our Time Steward Miss. Winnie McMullin had to withdraw due to ill health. Many thanks Winnie for the time you did give us. The position was taken over by Miss. Annetto Eve and we are all very grateful to Annetto for so ably assisting us in this capacity.

Equipment & Uniforms

Miss. Shirley Otto once again this season looked after this aspect of things for the Association. Many thanks to Shirley for the time put in here.

GROUNDS

Many thanks to the Grounds Committee for their time and effort in trying to keep the fields in good condition. It was hoped to have work done on No. 7 field during the off-season, but it would appear that this will not be possible.

PUBLICITY

JUNIOR SECRETARY'S REPORT

Ladies,

As Secretary I have much pleasure in presenting the 1978 Annual Report for the Brisbane Junior Committee.

This season has undoubtedly been our most successful to date with a total of 31 teams competing in 5 divisions, namely 16 years and under A & B; 14 years and under A. & B and 12 years and under.

We successfully conducted a junior carnival, which attracted a total nomination of 47 teams in three age groups. Fifteen of these teams were from country centres. Division winners were as follows, and every player was presented with a pennant:-

Nominations for Brisbane representative teams opened on 1st April and closed on 22nd April. A total of 117 nominations were received for the secondary teams and 45 for primary. Selectors chose a squad of 55 secondary and 33 primary girls. These squads were given training and trial games, and also competed in a Mini Carnival against Gold Coast. Teams were then selected and intensive training was given to these sides, and they also played in Brisbane, Norths and Commercial carnivals. As a result all Brisbane teams performed excellently at the State Championships in Mackay and Gympie.

Fund raising activities throughout the season placed us in a good financial position, and we were able to present all representative players with a Brisbane Junior badge, while secondary and Manageresses received \$5 each to offset some expenses; primary were given a Tee shirt. All players and Manageresses purchased a Brisbane Junior jacket with the Brisbane emblem and date attached. The girls were, and still are proud to wear their jackets, and advertisement to everyone that they had represented Brisbane.

Winning premiership teams were also presented with a junior badge, which denoted the work Premiers on each badge.

I would like to thank all Executive members for their co-operation throughout the year, and sincerely hope that the junior section continues to grow and operate efficiently. I am sure that if all committee members work as a team with the ultimate goal of improving Brisbane standards both 'on and off' the field, success will be the result.

Convening umpires for junior games still remains a problem, so further co-operation in this area is required from senior sections of clubs.

As retiring Secretary, I wish the incoming committee all the best for the future season.

GROUNDS COMMITTEE REPORT

I make this report on behalf of the Grounds Committee of the B.W.H.A. with headquarters at Downey Park.

There is little need to stress the urgent need for all playing areas to be top dressed and rested, but this is almost an impossibility. Other avenues must be exploited.

Apart from the work done by Mr. & Mrs. McDougall during the entire season such as filling in depressions & dangerous holes, nothing was done to maintain the fields. We are in the unhappy position to have to share our playing area and consequently cannot really rest any fields; we need the area to enable all fixtures to be played. The only alternative is to start earlier on Saturdays and rest a field. Is this possible? I doubt it.

There is much to be said for the system carried out most successfully in two major country centres. Clubs are allotted a field, the members have to keep the grass down, mark the field and keep it watered and grassed. A tall order, but if the day comes when the B.C.C. does not have grass cut and the season is a very dry one with the scoring zones becoming dust bowls, we may have to think seriously about maintenance in this way.

Players could do much towards preserving the "circle" on all fields. Regardless of the conditions every Saturday players warm up in the "circle" area. This is the unforgivable sin in every other state; you warm up on spare ground and there is plenty in Downey Park. Players have had plenty of time to practise "corner" systems and the goalie has no need to stand in the net at pre-match warm ups. She finds the ball belted at her anyway. The stirring up of dust in the circle, the kicking up of tufts of grass by goalie and players who miss-hit the ball and the wear and tear on the line markings all add up to destruction of the all important "circle" - when it has been raining, the destruction is worse.

The majority of players and supporters obeyed the "clean up your own litter rule" but there is still room for improvement.

You will observe the necessity for backboards on nets to be painted and nets themselves sprayed for rust and sighting. More corner nets are needed and these should be painted.

You will be told of an area that is being rested by Softball. This is one chance of having work done on the area. One decent field could eventuate but it will be then up to Hockey to rest an area during winter as a reciprocal favour to Softball. It would then be their task to do up that area.

I would suggest that B.W.H.A. contact Q.W.A.S.C. for three new stands for the area where Hockey and Softball are played. New stands purchased last season are still firmly entrenched in the Netball area. New ones would obviate the necessity to approach the B.C.C. to have stands brought over to our area. We could do with three quite easily.

I am compelled to stress the urgency for work on the fields and suggest that if such work is contemplated then a meeting with Mr. Bowler of the B.C.C. be arranged to work out what assistance if any can be given. According to the Q.W.A.S.C. Constitution, the Lessees of Downey Park are entirely responsible for all maintenance of the area, which includes all buildings.

The new club shelter shed built by the Redcliffe past players is a definite asset to the Park, and the club is to be congratulated for the enterprise shown.

Parking by hockey players leaves a lot to be desired. I have just completed reading an Annual Report of an Association of which I am a Trustee, and saw an amount of \$400 for parking fees for the season. This Association has a man to direct cars into the parking area, resulting in excellent parking where anyone can get their car in or out without problems for them and the P.A. announcer. It is not funny being hemmed in by a car which has been parked without any consideration for anyone. The man is employed for two
