## SECRETARY'S REPORT

1991 was another hectic year for Management and Players alike. Our sport is still growing with our largest influx in the Junior ranks filtering through to the Seniors. Downey Park and QE11 were used to their full potential but I feel the time is fast approaching when we will see night-time fixtures at QE11.

The last AGM was well attended and we welcomed all the new office bearers. Mrs Proctor supplied a lovely supper which everyone stayed to enjoy.

Our annual dinner to thank all the hard workers for the Association was held at the Downey Park clubhouse, a first and hopefully an annual event. The night was a great success and everyone had a good time.

Along came the annual Christmas in Storyland held at the City Hall to help the Lord Mayor's Charities raise money for its many causes. Thank you to all the girls who volunteered their time to act as ushers.

Our successful nominees for Australia Day Awards were Heather Scraggs for her Administrative prowess and Tammy Cole for her participation and excellence achieved in Hockey. Tammy received her award at the Presentation Ceremony held at the City Hall. Heather was awarded hers at Downey Park on opening day by Lord Mayor Sallyanne Atkinson.

This year Management decided to break from tradition and have two half days instead of the all day meeting to discuss and decide the calendar for the coming year.

Affiliation and registration forms were given out to clubs at the first Council meeting in February. BWAHA affiliated with the Queensland Women's Hockey Association and Queensland Women's Amateur Sports Council.

Affiliation forms were received from 21 clubs consisting of 83 teams which became 10 Divisions and Veterans. A new club Everton Districts joined our ranks and were very successful in their inaugural year.

In March nomination forms for the Brisbane and State Open and Veterans teams were opened. Clubs were asked to attend a Working Bee to get the park ready for the start of the season.

Nearly all clubs fulfilled their obligation and a lot of back breaking work was completed.

Fine weather greeted us for the first fixture (2nd year in a row) and hockey went ahead without a hitch. Life members, sponsors and official guests were invited to afternoon tea to mark opening day. Nominations closed for the Open and Veterans teams.

At the April Council Meeting the Under 18 nomination forms were given to club delegates to be completed and returned by April 27th. The Open and Veterans teams were named on the same day.

President's Cup was held at Downey Park on Sunday 26th May. Mr Peter Watterson, the Sales Manager for our sponsors Schweppes presented the player of the match in each division with a T shirt as a memento of their achievement. This elite group made up the President's Eleven for 1991.

In June the Open and Veterans teams played in Gympie for the State Championships. Brisbane acquitted itself very well with Brisbane 1 being State Champions, Brisbane 2 finished 2nd and Brisbane 3 finished 8th. The Brisbane 1 Veterans came in 3rd and Brisbane 2 came 2nd in their divisions. Tracey Belbin was named player of the Championships. All players and officials represented Brisbane well. No fixtures were played at Downey Park on June 8th. Congratulations to all players, umpires, coaches and managers named in the Open, Under 21 and Veterans teams and/or squads.

This year the Under 18 Champions were held in July at Bundaberg. Brisbane was once again well represented with Brisbane 1 finishing State Champions. Brisbane 2 came 2nd and Brisbane 3 finished 5th. Samantha Rich was named Player of the Championship. Players, coaches and managers were named for the State team. Congratulations to all.

On Saturday 24 August the last fixture day for 1991, Minor Premiers trophies were presented to the leading team in each division. Life members who had donated a trophy for each division presented same to the appropriate team. Mrs Glossop came and presented the "Pam Glossop" Trophy for the highest representative honours to Tracey Belbin.

The Ricoh dinner was held on Thursday 29 August at the Tivoli Theatre Restaurant. Debbie Wise from Commercial was the winner on a countback from Teresa Kuss of Ascot. A great night was had by all who attended. The print media coverage of the award was excellent. Thank you to Ricoh for their continuing support, and to Ros Julien and Kaye Pulsford for their hard work in organising this excellent night.

Finals were played at Downey Park on Saturday 14th September for Divisions 4 to 10 and Veterans. All teams who contested the finals stayed to make a memorable afternoon in the clubhouse. Trophies were presented to the winning teams. Umpiring awards were presented to those who had attained badges. BWHA also presented players who had represented Brisbane with a small token to thank them and to help alleviate costs.

Sunday 15th September the finals of Divisions 1 to 3 were played at QE11. The Division 1 final was won by Eastern Suburbs and the 'Shirley Higgins Memorial Trophy' was presented by Shirley's daughter Jan Salan. All three finals were good games. Congratulations to all teams who played in grand finals.

Brisbane was well represented by players who were picked in all teams to represent Queensland at the various State Titles. Congratulations to all these players. Coaches, managers and umpire positions were also filled from within our Brisbane ranks.

Nominations were opened for all official positions, these will be announced at the AGM. A few positions are still vacant and hopefully they will be filled before the start of the 1992 season.

## TREASURER'S REPORT.

Our Finance Committee this year was albeit a 'Claytons' committee which was very disappointing as finance is an integral part of our association.

A budget for 1991 was set in January and I am happy to report that we have been able to end the year almost on target. This was achievable because the grounds committee did not spend all their allocated funds. Extra funds will be needed for this committee in the coming season to upgrade the fields after the very dry season for the Under 13 championships to be held in Brisbane next year. A mobile sprinkler was purchased this year to ease the burden of carrying and dragging hoses across the fields.

Q.E. 11 once again was a costly field for players. 97.41% of all income from Clubs is paid direct to Brisbane City Council leaving only 2.59% for administration etc.

Affiliation fees were about the same as the previous year but registrations increased. Q.W.H.A. charge per player thus we have to charge this way to cover all players with QWHA registration and insurance. Although this system created some major hassles at the beginning of the year I believe it is the better way to pay fees.

Representative players were assisted again this year with \$1760 being given direct to State players and each player who represented BWHA given assistance with accommodation and bus costs. Five teams travelled to Gympie and three Under 18 teams to Bundaberg.

Sponsorship was received from Fosters - \$4675.00 and Schweppes - \$1230.00. D B E Ricoh again provided the Ricoh Medal and cameras plus the maintenance on the photocopier.

The security system maintenance -\$939.00 was well spent again as we had no losses from the two break-ins this year. The insurance company have now put an excess of \$200.00 on all glass claims.

The canteen was our major source in income for the season. Even though prices were increased on some items & sales volume increased markedly, little monetary gain was realised.

Nett profit on the canteen was \$12 833.72. Although trade in the bar appeared good takings were down on last year by almost \$3000.00. Profit on sales from the bar \$5496.92.

Rent of the Clubhouse increased this year and with the booking we have for the next year we should be able to spend some funds on upgrading the facilities.

A reduction in fines was a welcome relief this year. Lets hope this trend continues in future.

Loan payments were increased to offset the interest rates. The finance committee have anticipated that we could pay off the loan by mid 1992. This will allow funds to be directed in many other areas.

Rates show a marked increase but this figure includes the rent on Rasey Park.

Our best value for money this year was Promotion. \$1227.00 was spent but the returns were ten fold.

Administration costs were up due to some capital expenditure - namely a computer, extra cupboards in the upstairs office, and a T V and Video for the Clubhouse. We also employed a Typist this season to alleviate the pressure on the Secretary.

We produced our own Grand Final book again this year. Gate takings at Q E 11 on the day enabled us to not charge Clubs for their games.

My thanks to Joyce Proctor for collecting all funds from raffles, equipment sales and the Ricoh dinner, and Carolyn Schomberg for banking the bar money each week.

A small number of proposed amendments to the By-Laws will be considered at the 1990 Annual General Meeting. The subjects of these proposed amendments are as follows:  
Requirement to sit for the umpires exam (By-Law 11);  
Player qualification for cup finals (By-Law 9(a));  
Player qualification for semi-finals & finals (By-Law 8(a)).

## STATE HOCKEY CENTRE

At the January meeting of the QE11 Joint Committee, the QWHA and QHA Presidents had organised a meeting with the State Government regarding the building of a State Hockey Centre. The Queensland Government had indicated that sporting bodies should submit submissions for use of Government Grants that initiated from poker machines money. From that initial meeting, a committee was appointed from representatives from QWHA, QHA, BWA and BHA. Committee members were Mr Keith Nix, Mr John Giles, Mr Daryl Richards, Mr Nev Crase and Mr Bob McPherson.

In March a comprehensive submission was presented by Mrs Daphne Pirie (President, QWHA) and Mr Keith Mapp (President, QHA) to Mr Bob Gibbs, Minister for Tourism, Sport and Racing. The cost of the centre was \$11,682,000.00 and the most preferred sites were Gateway Arterial Nudgee, Ferny Grove and Colmslie.

Since that meeting a Finance Committee comprising Mr Keith Nix, Mr John Giles, Mr Ted Spice, Mr Daryl Richards and Miss Denise McManus to look into the funding of such a centre, was initiated.

After visiting hockey centres in other states, Queensland must look into building a complex in future years. Although the centre is still a few years down the track, a study such as this with working committees must investigate it thoroughly for when finances DO become available.

BWA has a copy of the submission for any interested persons to view.

## GROUNDS COMMITTEE REPORT

The 1991 season has been one where the majority of labour hours has been spent on repairs and general upkeep.

The main activities for the year included:

Existing nets repaired and refurbished. Completion of fitting backboards to nets. All thirteen fields at Downey Park have nets with backboards.

Field repair at the start of the season. One hundred rolls of turf laid to areas damaged by softball.

Initial layout and continuous linemarking of 13 hockey and 1 modified field at Downey Park and 4 modified and 3 minkey fields at Rasey Park.

Replacement of 40 nets onto fields at Downey Park and Rasey Park.

Pre-season repairs and general season maintenance to mower. For the 1992 season we suggest the purchase of a new mower, as further major work is required on the "old" Morrison. (Gearbox, motor, belts and rollers etc.)

Field repair, dimension checking and marking of championship fields for both Under 15 and Under 11 Southern Cross Cup Competitions.

All playing fields at both Downey Park and Rasey Parks were sprayed to control weeds during the past season.

Due to drought conditions this season, much sprinkling of fields was required and to enable more efficient watering with less labour involvement, a Trailco T100 Travelling sprinkler was purchased at a cost of \$1776.

Improvements and repairs were made to fencing along the drain at fields 10, 11 and 12 to prevent balls from going under the wire. It is planned for the same to be done to fencing beside fields 7, 8 and 9 prior to next season.

Brian Williams (Norths) had kindly donated the use of a tractor and his time, along with our hiring of a groundhog to aerate all fields at Downey Park to promote root growth and turf growth. This work cannot be done until after we have received the second spring rains.

The manufacture of another 4 nets was performed. The fitting of backboards will be completed in time for the 1992 season.



All nets were removed from playing fields and have been stored at both Downey and Rasey Parks.

The 1991 season has been very time demanding for the committee in their endeavour to supply good playing surfaces under such harsh, dry conditions. As can be seen from the above report, many voluntary hours have been spent by such a small band of workers to provide the facilities for hundreds of both Senior and Junior players.

In closing this report, I would wish to thank my committee - Noala Gordon, Doug Broadfoot, John Bigg, Peter Fleming, Harry Smith, Laurie Goldsmith, Sid Holcroft and Keith Nix; Management Liaison Rose Broadfoot; Senior President Jenny Tidey; Junior President Marilyn Chatfield; BWA and BWA Junior Management; Keith Tidey and all fathers and supporters of hockey for their support and assistance throughout the year.

## UMPIRE'S REPORT

The umpiring aspect of our season began this year with our usual pre-season rules discussion, held in late March and though most clubs were represented, the attendance was nevertheless a little disappointing, compared with previous years. In the interests of safety, and in an effort to reduce the number of stoppages in the game, two new local rules were introduced -

- (1) All substitute goal-keepers must wear protective headgear when defending at penalty corners and penalty strokes.
- and
- (2) Except for the goalkeeper, all substitutions using the interchange system will be made without any stoppage of the game at the centre line.

All teams made a special effort to implement these changes, and except for a few minor difficulties during the early stages I believe they achieved their purpose.

Other meetings were held regularly once a month for all panel members and those umpires being tested, and for any interested umpires and players. One special aspect of umpiring was discussed each meeting, and this seemed to fuel some interest in the first half of the season; however, enthusiasm appeared to wane as the season progressed. An effort was made to help clubs learn how to coach umpires by offering to work with a number of clubs each week in the first round, but this was successful for the first week only as after this no clubs availed themselves of the opportunity.

Congratulations are due to those umpires who distinguished themselves this year in a variety of ways -

- (1) To Jan Hadfield who was selected to officiate at the Inter-Nations Tournament in Brussels in April/May, and the Olympic Qualifying Tournament in New Zealand in October.
- (2) To Michele Arnold who was awarded her International badge at the F.I.H. meeting in April, and who returned in late May after a most enjoyable and rewarding 5 month tour overseas, where she was able to gain experience in both coaching and umpiring.

These commitments by both Jan and Michele prevented them from attending the National Senior Championships in Perth this year as members of the National Umpiring Panel.

Congratulations to Sue Weimers on achieving her State A badge this year at the State Championships in Gympie and to all other successful candidates who were awarded badges during the season - a full list is included at the end of this report. Many umpires at the Senior badge level this year did not maintain a high enough level of consistency in their umpiring to be awarded higher badges, but I am sure that with some effort and dedication this can be achieved in the future. It was most encouraging to see many talented young umpires coming up through the ranks, and the Junior Association and individual clubs are to be praised on developing these young umpires of the future. It is hoped that those coaching can take the opportunity to work with these umpires earlier next season so that they can apply advice and be moved up to officiate on higher games.

Thanks to those many top umpires who nominated to attend the State Senior and Vets Championships, but it is also necessary to encourage more higher badged umpires to be available for the under ago level championships as well, especially the Under 18's, where there always appears to be a shortage of both quality umpires and assessors to fully perform duties effectively.

Heather was able to attend the Hockey Rules Board meeting in Brussels again this year, and returned to report no new rules for the season, but with a recommendation from F.I.H. to encourage all nations to discuss, and experiment with ways of improving the image and flow of the game.

On Jan's return from Brussels in May, she reported a more liberal interpretation of obstruction when a player is receiving a ball. In an effort to immediately implement this Jan demonstrated to umpires and players at several sessions carrying it through at the June weekend to all who attended the discussions. Generally, all parties coped with this soundly, and of course this also helped greatly to improve the flow of the game.

The Umpires examination was held in July, and a total of 104 candidates sat. Congratulations to all who gained passes, and a full list follows this report. Next season it will be compulsory for all Division 1-4 players to sit until a pass is gained. This ruling is meant to help all players gain a greater understanding of the game.

This year on grand-final day for Division 4 and below, in an effort to give all players the best umpires for these games, these divisions were allocated badged umpires. This experiment, I am confident, ensured that the teams playing the most skilful hockey won through - however, it did reveal that a major re-education of most players, coaches and spectators, besides lower grade umpires, needs to be attempted to keep hockey at this level abreast of modern interpretations. In an effort to do this, and to help clubs help themselves, the Umpires' Board has recommended that B.W.H.A. write to Q.W.H.A. asking for a Junior Umpire Coaching Accreditation Course to be held in Brisbane next season with all clubs being required to have one person attend, if badging is of the required standard.

My sincere thanks to all umpires for their co-operation this season, and to all members of the Umpires Board for their time and efforts spent in coaching and testing. It must be realised that all have very busy schedules - umpiring, playing and coaching, and thus it is difficult to carry out these duties to everyone's satisfaction. A special thanks also to Sue Weimers, who has helped in the sphere of umpire coaching at regular intervals.

My sincere appreciation to B.W.H.A. for their support during the season, and especially to Lyn Thomas, who plays a vital role in all areas of umpiring, and carries out tremendous work behind the scenes.

### JUNIOR PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The time has come again to reflect back on another successful season. Junior hockey continues to grow with approximately 1100 girls registered from ages 5 to 17. Rasey Park also had some improvements this year. A canteen was opened for the first time, and was well supported by our future olympians and their parents. The funds generated through the canteen will make Rasey Park self funding. Congratulations to Helen and her committee for the competent manner in which you organised our nursery groups.

Congratulations also to all clubs who were successful in this years premierships, and to our representative teams, the hard work you put into training is well worth it.

What a terrible year for our Grounds Committee. The time and energy you have put into the fields this year seemed useless, perhaps next year you should look into employing a rainmaker. Thank you for your great efforts in a very difficult year.

Many thanks to Senior Management for their support and assistance throughout 1991. Also to hard working club officials, without your help, hockey would be non-existent.

Special thanks to my management and committees. These ladies work tirelessly for hockey for 10 months of the year. Thank you for your time and your friendship.

Brisbane will be hosting the State Under 13 championships next year, so I hope 1992 will be even more successful on and off the hockey field.

I have enjoyed my second year as president, thank you for the honour and I look forward to next season.

## JUNIOR SECRETARY'S REPORT.

1991 - where did it go? It only seems like yesterday that Management were preparing for the season, hoping that we didn't forget anything and that everything would run smoothly and now the season is over! Our representative teams performed very well at Southern Cross and won the U/13A, U/13B, U/15A and U/15B divisions and in doing so, won the Southern Cross Cup which is awarded to the centre with the highest aggregate points score at the end of the second round. Our U/13 teams won the A Grade and the C Grade at the State Championships in Cairns. The B team gained third place in the B Grade. The U/15 teams were not quite as successful but the U/15C team were runners up in C Grade. The U/15A team finished fourth in A Grade and the U/15B team managed third place in B Grade. The skills day at Rasey Park was a great success with Tracey Belbin and Tammy Cole presenting the awards. A full report will be given by the convener later in the report.

## HOCKEY SHOP REPORT

1991

Little did I realise the task that lay ahead of me when I offered to supervise the 'Hockey Shop'. The Junior Association was in need of a convenor for the hockey shop and I volunteered to do this knowing that I could rely on the help of some Mums from Saint Andrews Ladies Hockey Club (Juniors) who are always there when work needs to be done.

The format of the hockey shop for 1991 was to be greatly changed from that of previous years with 'Just Hockey' offering to stock it in return for the Junior Association running it. 'The Shop', as it came to be called, stocked everything that any girl playing hockey needed. With the advent of this increased stock a system was worked out so that anyone who was required to work in the shop could do so with the minimum of training.
